district, had not been heard from. Mr. Hunt attributed this to the overlapping of the deer season which called many of the canvassers into the field away from their businesses.

Donations for the campaign are still being collected daily. Mr. Hunt told The Enterprise Monday. "Just today I received some checks," he said. "A couple were for five dollars, and some for more." Although the campaign was not intended to extend beyond November 19, lack of final reports from some canvassers has postponed final closing. Money for the fund will continue to be welcomed.

Whether or not Farmington will make the goal it has established for itself still is not known, although last week it was expected final reports would be ready for publication by now. However, deer season has slowed last-minute canvassing.

The meeting planned for Tuesday night was scheduled to be called at 8 p.m. Purpose of the meeting was to allow final decisions to be made by members of the Budget and Admissions committee regarding establishing the final budget and apportioning the collected money. The budget was firmly established earlier because of the inability to determine eligibility of some of the participating agencies.

Farmington civic, military, and religious organizations have solidly supported the United campaign, as evidenced by the list of contributors.
