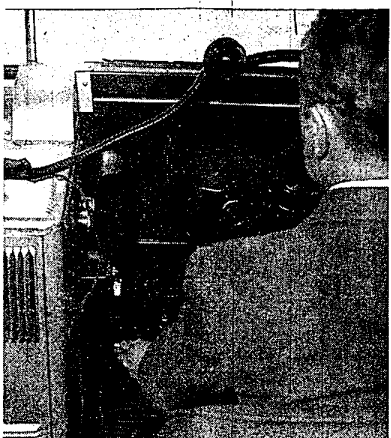

## Voice Of The "Talking School Bus"



Arvel Brill demonstrates the "Safety Voice". The microphone and the PA system, which Mr. Brill is turning on, is connected to two loud speakers, one inside the bus and the other under the hood.

If a school bus should stop you on the street and ask the time of day or comment on the weather, don't be amazed. Thanks to the fertile brain of a local business man and the mechanical mind of his daughter's boy friend, the talking school bus has become a reality and a boon to drivers and passengers alike.

Specifically, the talking school bus is a regular school bus with "Safety Voice" attached. This is a public address system with a microphone at the driver's side and speakers inside and outside the school bus. With it, the driver can speak through either of the loudspeakers and be heard by all inside the bus. From his vantage point above traffic, he can caution youngsters outside the bus.

From his seat, the driver can speak through either of the loudspeakers. The PA system commands the attention of the youngsters, according to its inventor, and makes the driver audible despite confusion and racket inside the vehicle. Outside, the driver is able to direct the youngsters crossing the street and control their actions in traffic.

To do the gimmick has been very successful—Dor Stuck, Chief of Organization and Transportation, State Department of Public Instruction, lauded the invention at the bus drivers' convention held last week. The state has shown its reaction to the speaker system by approving reimbursement to purchase the system.

Mr. Brill, father of the "Safety Voice" came up with the idea last spring. Having worked with school buses for many years, and from funeral services were held from Thursday afternoon at 2 p.m. with Rev. A. Stanley Stone officiating. Burial will take place in Park View Memorial Cemetery.
