**FARMINGTON LIONS CLUB SPONSORS LEADER DOG SEALS**

"Be Thankful You Can See" seals have been forwarded through the mail to residents of the Farmington Area by the Farmington Lions Club, it was announced this week.

The seals are a part of the fund raising program of the Lions Clubs of Michigan in behalf of the Rochester-Leader Dog League. The League handles the training of leader dogs for the blind. According to the Farmington Lions Club, the Rochester-Leader Dog League, whose headquarters are in Rochester, Michigan, cost nearly \$100,000 to operate last year. They also state that the demand for these dogs necessitates that the institution be expanded.

Helping the blind in the community is a major project of the Farmington Lions Club. They are furnishing many glasses for those who have only partial sight. The Lions Clubs are also aiding in financing necessary eye operations and contribute to the teaching of Braille to the blind.

**Doctor Credits Mechanic For Saving Girl's Life**

"Credit for saving Laura Cassel's life should go to the fellow who thought of sawing off that gear shift lever instead of trying to remove it," physician Joseph Gadbaw told The Enterprise Monday. Dr. Gadbaw, the Cassel family's doctor, was called to Redford Receiving Hospital Friday to attend the 29-year old girl, stabbed by the gear shift lever in an auto collision in Detroit.

Miss Cassel, daughter of Jack Cassel of 15400 Lola Drive, Redford Township, was taken to Harper Hospital for surgery after recommendation by Dr. Gadbaw. At Harper, the nine inches of lever imbedded in the girl's chest was removed. The lever missed all important blood vessels, organs, and the spine. The girl will recover rapidly with no ill effects, doctors say.

Miss Cassel is the niece of the Robert Cassels of Grand River Avenue.

**BOARD MEMBERS ATTEND U. OF M. SCHOOL MEETING**

Gerald Domes, President of the Farmington Township School District Board of Education, Rufe Smith, secretary, and O. E. Dunclet, superintendent, attended the Conference Workshop for School Board members held Tuesday at the University of Michigan.

Conference sessions were held in the Rackham Building on the U. of M. campus. General sessions were held the morning with Alexander Ruthven, President of the University, welcoming the delegates. Grant Burns, Dearborn, President of the Michigan Association of School Boards, also addressed the group.

John Lesinski, United States Representative from the 16th Congressional District and Chairman of the House Committee on Education, spoke on Federal Aid to Education. Don Vander Werp, Fremont, State Senator from the 26th District, spoke on State Aid to Education. He criticized the Sales Tax Diversion Amendment. Louis Schimmel, president of the Pontiac Board of Education and Director of the Michigan Advisory Council, spoke on local aid. He emphasized the importance of a well planned program of selecting qualified personnel and furnishing adequately equipped buildings. He also criticized the Sales Tax Diversion Amendment in policy but stated that it was necessary because of the failure of the Legislature to appropriate proper funds for operation of the schools.

The afternoon session was confined to special conference groups.

The only time we feel like shoppin' is when we pass the Men's Furnishing Store window then we stand lookin' so long cause it's so purty that we aint got no time left fer shoppin'. Now if you don't wanna be fouled up fer fowl you better gitcher turkey or goose or chicken order in pretty quick-like now. You will — wontcha???

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
