Two church services will be held, one at 9:30 a.m. and the other at 11:45 a.m. The children's choir will present a fantasy of Christmas songs at the 11:45 service on Sunday.

Seth Dingham's "Gabriel From The Heaven Descending" will be the featured number by the choir.

"Old Tidings" is to be the theme of the Sunday School Christmas program at the Methodist Church Thursday evening at 7:30 p.m. Deane Jones will play a piano solo, and Alice Lancaster will give a musical recitation at this program.

A chorus from the Methodist Children's Village and other children will assist in telling of the Christmas story in recitation and song. Children attending the program will be presented with candy gifts.

At the Christmas Day ceremonies at the Methodist Church, the church choir and the Children's choir will present special music. Bob Wiley will be soloist. The Hallelujah Chorus will conclude the program, composed of traditional Christmas music, including selections from Handel's "Messiah", and a Christmas message from Rev. A. Stanley Stone.

At 7:30 p.m. on Christmas Eve, the Salem Evangelical and Reformed Church will be the scene of a Christmas pageant directed by Mr. E. B. Tyler, Sunday School superintendent, and the Sunday School teachers. The younger children will have recitations and songs, and the older children will present the Nativity pageant.

On Christmas morning at Salem Church, a candlelight and carol service will be held at 8 a.m. More holiday services will take place at the church on December 31 at 11:45 a.m. when a devotional service is presented, and on Sunday, January 1, when a communion service is held at 10 a.m.

The Christmas holiday season will be celebrated at Grace Lutheran Church with two Christmas services. The Christmas Eve midnight service, at 11:30 p.m. December 24, will be preceded at 11 p.m. by an organ concert by Miss Dorothy Gaertner. The Senior Choir, directed by Mrs. Victor Halbach, will sing Bach's "Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring" and "Christ the Holy Child," by F. Williams.

There will be only the 11 a.m. service on Christmas Day, and no Sunday school. Miss Shirley Cunningham will be soloist, singing "Birthdays of a King".

At the Livonia Methodist Church, Seven Mile near Farmington Road, the choir will give a cantata "The Shepherd's Christmas" on Friday night at 7:45 at the church. Rupert Otto is conductor and organist.

At Our Lady of Sorrows Church, Christmas Masses will be held at midnight Saturday, and at 7:30, 10, and 11:30 a.m. Christmas Day. The Men's choir and Boys' Choir will sing at the midnight and the 10 a.m. Masses.

company would take the meters and repair the sidewalks at no cost to the city.

NINETY METERS

According to the survey, approximately 90 meters are recommended. They would cover both sides of Grand River from Warner Street on the east to the Town Hall park on the west, and on Farmington Road from State Street on the south to Oakland Avenue on the north. They recommended that the parking meters be installed early in the spring, was pointed out at the meeting that nearly all of the communities in this area have installed meters and that they assist greatly in the parking problem. According to estimates given at the meeting, the meters should bring in a revenue of approximately \$5,000 a year. The meters would cost the city a little over \$5,000 to purchase.

James Cavanaugh, commissioner of public buildings, stated that an estimate of the repairs to the Boy Scout cabin had been made. He stated that the floor of the cabin is in bad condition as well as the roof. Cavanaugh stated that several logs have rotted and will have to be removed. He added that there is a possibility that the Township may share some of the cost of repair. The matter was left in Cavanaugh's hands to complete the details.

ASK FOR SIGNS

Several people from the Floral Pick area appeared before the commission to see if some action could be taken to secure street signs in the area. They also mentioned signs on the dead end streets. The Commission stated that the purchase of signs would be placed in the next year's budget.

The Commission approved the purchase of two steel desks and chairs from the Rayhaven Equipment Company to be used in the new city hall offices. Mayor Hamlin was reappointed to a 3 year term on the Board of Appeals. A motion was made to pay the Library Board \$500 of the \$1,000 yearly budget with the remaining \$500 to be paid later. A tight survey by the Detroit Edison Company has been requested by the city with emphasis on street lights at Grand River and Orchard Lake, Grand River at Nine Mile Road, and on Power Avenue north of Grand River.
