Here's Simple Way To Entertain Large, Small Group During Holidays

Mid the clamor of last minute shopping and planning holiday meals, many homemakers will want to be entertaining. A Christmas buffet is one of the nicest ways of serving friends whether the group be large or small. Holiday decorations provide a pleasant background and simple dishes, perfectly prepared and cleverly garnished, will be the hostess' pride.

SAUSAGE CORN CAKES
For sausage corn cakes, completely brown bulk pork sausage in a frying pan with whole kernel corn. Make a thick batter and stir the corn and meat mixture into it. Add about two tablespoons of lard or drippings to the pan in which the sausage was cooked, then drop the mixture by spoonfuls into the hot drippings and brown the cakes on both sides.

For a main dish that requires little preparation time, serve a tasty combination of creamed ham and mushrooms. Suggests Reba Staggs, well known home economist. Diced cooked ham is added to white sauce along with little button mushrooms, chopped green pepper and grated onion. The ingredients are thoroughly heated and they are ready to be served. This creamed combination is temptingly served over crunchy Chinese noodles or for unique individual servings, hard rolls are hollowed out and stuffed with the creamed ham.

Raw cranberry salad and buttered broccoli in the menu will carry out the Christmas colors. Assorted relishes — pickles, olives, radishes, celery will add crunchiness. One of the simplest of desserts to please everyone comes on two trays — one filled with assorted Christmas cookies, the other filled with thin slices of rich fruit cake.

Small Perch Now Legal For Use As Bait

Winter anglers can use those tiny perch that peck away at their lines as bait to lure their more hefty relatives.

The conservation department's law enforcement division points out that formerly fishermen could keep only pan fish six inches or over — eliminating the legal use of small perch as bait.

HERE'S PORK ROAST MADE FOR STUFFING

Choose a cushion-style pork shoulder for an attractive, delicious and thrifty meat serving, suggests Reba Staggs, well-known home economist. This roast is a fresh pork picnic shoulder with the back and the arm bone removed. The meat dealer saws the shoulder where the bone is removed, leaving one side open for stuffing.

To combine with the pork flavor, a rice and sausage combination stuffing is exceptionally good. Other stuffing ingredients include: corn, green pepper or pimiento and fine cracker crumbs, sautéed with grated raw potato, cooled noodles seasoned with poppy seed, or apple slices and raisins.

With the stuffing sewed or skewered securely inside, the roast is placed fat side up on a rack in an open roasting pan. Water is not added and no basting is necessary. The pan is left uncovered and the meat cooked in a 350 degree F. oven until well done. A cushion-style pork shoulder requires from 35 to 40 minutes per pound roasting time.

Porcupine Mountain Ski Center Ready January 1

The conservation department announces the new ski center in the 42,000-acre Porcupine Mountains state park is nearing completion and with the selection of rope tows to service one of the runs, is expected to be ready for first public use shortly after New Year's.

Development of the ski layout in the largest park in the state, in progress for the past several months, includes a 2,800 foot expert ski trail with a drop in excess of 550 feet, a 2,500 foot intermediate run with a 350 foot drop, and a 1,500 foot open slope skiing area with a 350 foot drop. The open slope skiing area will be serviced by three rope tows.

The department's parks division has used prison labor for most of this work including construction of a building which doubles as a concession center and warming hut. Prisoners also have developed a parking area near the open slope run.
