Township Board

(Continued from Page One) A building inspector will be appointed by the Township Board for the purpose of making the necessary inspections. All plumbing work to be done in accordance with the requirements of the State Plumbing Code. All electrical work must comply with the National Electrical or State Code.

Any building moved from one lot to another must be made to conform to all the provisions of the Building Ordinance and shall not be moved until a building permit has been obtained from the Township Clerk.

No building, constructed, altered or repaired under a building permit shall be occupied in whole or in part for human habitation until a certificate of occupancy has been issued by the Township Clerk.

Any person or firm violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction, be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$100 or by imprisonment not to exceed 90 days or both at the discretion of the Trial Court.

OVERTIME PARKING CRACKDOWN SHOWS EARLY RESULTS

Farmington police issued 25 tickets last week for violation of parking rules, chief Joseph G. DeWent announced Tuesday. The tickets came as a result of the city commission's decision last week to enforce traffic rules in Farmington's business section.

Asked whether or not complaints and attempts to "fix" the tickets had been heard, the chief said, "Plenty." But they're all going to stick, so far as he's concerned.

TWO INJURED AS CARS COLLIDE HEAD-ON

Two men were injured Monday evening when their cars collided head-on east of Novi on U. S. 16. In the accident near the intersection of Charles Bowles, 64, and Tom R. Bonner, 29, received injuries.

Bonner, a Pinckney, Michigan, business man, engaged with a fracture of left leg. Bowles, Detroit attorney, suffered bruises and lacerations and a possible fractured collar-bone.

The accident occurred at 4:50 p.m. Monday. According to State Police records, Bowles' car was proceeding toward Farmington at approximately 40 miles per hour. The Bonner car was going toward Novi at the same speed.

The cars collided head-on when both attempted to pass other vehicles. Bowles' car had just passed the yellow line and was pulling into the center, police reports said, while the Bonner car was passing a tractor and trailer at the crest of a hill. Neither driver was held.

Sailor's Body Sent Home For Reburial

Mr. and Mrs. John G. Smith of 33299 Orchard Street have received word that the remains of their late son, Roland Jack, 52, along with two unidentified Navy men, have been returned to the United States for reburial in the Zachary Taylor National Cemetery, Louisville, Kentucky. Services will be held there January 25.

Roland enlisted in the Navy January 3, 1943, and was reported killed in September 11 aboard the U.S.S. Savannah, at Salerno, Italy. He was a veteran of the Sicily invasion.

Surviving besides his parents are two sisters, Lorraine and Lois, both at home, and one brother, Robert T., of Grove Street, Farmington.
