

## For Your Own Protection

Don't Buy ANY Gas Heating Equipment Unless Your Application Has Been Approved by Consumers Power Company

The Michigan Public Service Commission has issued an order permitting this Company to resume connecting additional gas space-heater customers.

The Commission acted on evidence supplied by the Company showing that our gas storage field problem has advanced to a point where restrictions on the sale of gas for heating houses and other buildings are no longer necessary.

This does not mean that EVERYONE can have gas househeating service immediately. Many can; others will have to wait a little longer because gas mains in their particular areas do not have capacity enough to supply the needs of all who want gas heat. This is true of some streets, some neighborhoods and even some communities.

Regulations on file with the Public Service Commission require that anyone wishing gas heating service must fill out a written application and obtain the Company's approval. This regulation is designed to protect both you and the present gas space-heating customers in your vicinity, whose service might suffer if too many customers were connected to existing facilities.

To avoid tying up your money in equipment you may not be able to use, please refrain from buying any gas space-heating equipment until and unless your written application has been approved in writing by the Company.\*

Boy, we're lucky! We got connections. Betcha you can't find a bad one in the lot of 'em. They're even graded. The large ones are 49c a dozen and the medium ones are 43c. They'd taste good with some of our hickory smoked bacon — wouldn't they?'
Betcha yuh never thought about this — but when you buy frozen

Betcha yuh never thought about this — but when you buy frozen foods from us — they've stayed frozen. They aint ever been thawed out and frozen agin cause we got a place to keep 'em cold. They aint frozen and thawed out and sold fer fresh either — like maybe perch fillets. They're only 38c a lb. and they're frozen. We got some strawberries, too. It's getting long about the itime of year when yuh git an itchin' fer that kind of stuff. Well you can have a box of berries all sweetened fer 39c. It's a full lb. package too, not jest 12 oz. We also got some frozen pineapple tidbits what taste jest like fresh pineapple that you can git a cuppla packages of fer 29c.

Our beautiful blonde butchers have some boneless rolled veal roasts fer only 49c a lb. And Mr. Mickleberry has come thru with some hot dogs what we can sell fer 39c a lb. Remember way back when we used to call hot dogs weiners? Then if you don't want hickory smoked bacon they've got some already packaged and sliced fer 35c a lb.
