Course that aint nothin' new — but it still aint got no bones. Probably aint got much meat either but it only costs 29c a lb. The sliced bacon is 35c a lb. and if its got bones in it they're only little we ones — they wont hurt much. Then off'n the good beef what is the only kind we got now we're gonna have some round and sirloin steaks fer 79c a lb. Those maybe aint so good fer Sunday dinner cause yuh figger yuh gotta have a roast of some kind and off'n the same beef we got some pot roasts fer 55c a lb. How big a pot yuh got???
