the organization of a special assessment district for the improvement of Edgewood Drive. Ernest Blanchard, Township supervisor, stated that he had the necessary petitions but desired to hold them until a clarification could be received from the County Road Commission.

It was explained that several procedures could be followed. A special assessment tax could be spread over a two year period, at the end of which time road construction could begin; or petition the property owners, set up the special assessment district, and sell bonds so that construction could begin. The Board pointed out that the spreading of the tax over two years was the easier and less expensive way, but that the selling of the bonds would make the money available earlier for construction. The problem would be the sale of the bonds and the increased legal work involved.

Building Code Subject Of Civic Meetings

The Farmington Township Civic Association has resolved to oppose the passage of the Farmington Township Building Code, Frank Gossett, president, stated Tuesday in a statement to The Enterprise.

Gossett said "The executive board feels that the ordinance is too strict for the working class of people who comprise about 75% of Farmington Township."

At a public meeting Friday, questions regarding the meaning of the code were discussed by the association. No answers were available to the questions at the meeting. However, Gossett stated that the code would eliminate home owners' finishing their own home after occupancy. The code stipulates that a certificate of inspection must be obtained before occupancy of the house is made.

More discussion of the building code, as well as other township matters, will be made Tuesday night when the Southeast Farmington Township Civic Association, strong proponents of the code, meet at the new school on Middlebelt Road, just north of Ten Mile Road.
