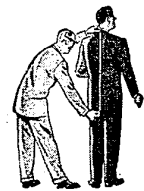

After a short meeting, the evening was given to past presidents and teachers.

PTA president Mr. George Midlewood introduced the visitors, and as each visitor was introduced, a candle was lit in their memory and in recognition of their work in past years.

The first candle was lit for the late Mrs. Ethel Midlewood, Pierson's first PTA president of 25 years ago.
