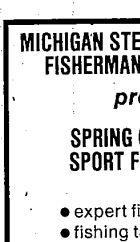

Undefeated Farmington Places 5 Matmen On Area First Team

Farmington High swept top billing in the '72-'73 All-Observer prep wrestling selections with five Falcons making their way to the All-Area first team.

The Falcon liveones of Dan Longtine, John Osentoski, Jack Gardner, Mark Churella and Jeff Krause captured the limelight, with seven other schools filling the remaining seven slots.

The 12-man team accounted for 339 wins in dual competition, lost 77 matches and tied five.

At 98 pounds, Farmington's Dan Longtine captured No. 1 billing.

The Falcon senior was co-captain of his undefeated squad and chalked up a 36-3 dual record, along with first in the (North) Farmington Invitational, Redford Union Invitational, Oakland County Tourney, an Inter-Lakes League title, a second at Schoolcraft and a district crown.

An All-Stater in his junior year, John Osentoski captured his second consecutive All-Observer berth at 105 pounds.

The Farmington senior compiled a dual record of 26-5, took first in the North Farmington, Redford Union and Schoolcraft Invitational and won the Inter-Lakes crown.

Bentley's Pete Beck was selected the No. 1 grappler at 112 pounds. The Bulldog senior and co-captain racked up a 27-4 dual record, took first in the Western Wayne, Garden City and Livonia tourneys, second in the Suburban Eight, first in the state districts and fourth in the regionals.

Tom Fletke of Thurston is the top 119 pounder in the area. The Eagle senior scored a 22-10-3 dual record, took seconds at the Schoolcraft and Catholic Central Invitionals, first at the RU Tourney, fourth in the Wayne Invitational and second in the Northwest Suburban.

At 126 pounds, North Farmington's Steve Haller is No. 1.

The Raiders' most valuable wrestler is one of two juniors on the first team and has been voted co-captain for North for the '73-'74 season.

Haller scored a 27-10 record this year, was second in the

Bedford Invitational, fourth in the Oakland County Tourney, North Farmington Invitational champion at 126 pounds, fourth in the Edsel Ford Invitational, and Northwest Suburban champion.

The other junior on the 12-man team is Farmington's Jack Gardner.

Gardner was 34-9, won the Inter-Lakes Conference crown, took first in the Walled Lake Western Quad and districts, third in the regionals and second at North Farmington, in the 132 pound slot.

The solo sophomore to make the coveted squad is another Falcon grappler.

At 138 pounds, Mark Churella finished third in the state.

Churella went 13-6 in dual competition and was champion at the Oakland County meet, Redford Union and North Farmington Invitionals, third at Schoolcraft, district champ and regional champ and he still has two years left.

Farmington's liveones are rounded out by 145 pound senior Jeff Krause.

Krause was the Falcon co-captain and sported a 36-3 dual mark, won titles at Redford Union, North Farmington, Oakland County and Western Wayne along with the Inter-Lakes crown and placed third in the state regionals.

At 153 pounds, John Glenn's Bob Mink made his way to the All-Observer team for the second straight year.

Mink finished the '72-'73 season with a 31-6 dual mark and a three year Rocket record at 76-19.

Mink was champion for the second straight year at the Flint Beecher Invitational, Redford Union Invitational, Northwest Suburban League Meet and district clash and this season was first in the

regionals and second in the state meet and Catholic the No. 1 selection at 167 pounds.

Stevenson's Brian Partie is dual action and recorded a pin of 21 seconds.

The Spartan senior was Livonia Quad champion for the second straight year with all his wins via the pin route.

Partie was second in the Inter-Lakes, a district champion and fourth in the regionals before losing in the second round of the state finals.

Paul Matthews got the call for the 185 pound slot.

The Redford Union senior was 34-22 in dual play and won the Wayne Quad, the Walled Lake Central Takeodwa Tourney, Garden City East Invitational, Redford Union Invitational, North Farmington Invitational and the district and regionals at Walled Lake Western.

Matthews also won the Suburban Eight crown at 185 pounds.

To round out or "fill out" the case is heavyweight Bill Zukoff from Southfield High.

The Blue Jay senior was 35-7 in dual meets, was first in the RU Invitational, second at Clintonville and third at Schoolcraft, North Farmington and Catholic Central.

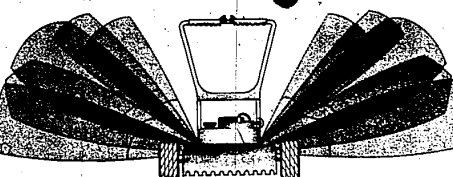
