Liquor License Curb Voted Down

LANSING — Private clubs practicing racial discrimination will still be able to retain liquor licenses because of action taken last week by the State House of Representatives.

In a 54-48 vote the House defeated an amendment which called for nullification of liquor licenses of private clubs practicing racial discrimination. The main bill would have exempted private clubs from submitting membership lists as a condition of license renewal.

Observerland legislators gave 7-1 support to the amendment.

Joining the opposition was Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park), whose district includes eastern Southfield and Lathrup Village.

JA Fund Drive Tops Its Quota

SOUTHFIELD — A national Junior Achievement fund-raising record has been set by the Southeastern Michigan JA organization.

The 1972 fund drive ended with an announcement that a total of \$511,781, or 102 per cent of the goal was raised. The drive began Feb. 1 and officially ended at noon March 20. The quota was \$502,500.

Announcement was made at a luncheon in the Raleigh House, Southfield, by Richard L. Terrell, general chairman of Junior Achievement of Southeastern Michigan.

Some 550 persons who participated in the seven-week drive attended the victory luncheon to hear the final report. The half-million dollars will be used to operate and expand JA business centers in Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Washtenaw, Monroe and Livingston counties.

The four units, formed from 31 divisions, each reported its goal amount raised, and percentage of quota.

Among the suburban groups reporting was Division 14 of Unit 2. The division, headquartered in Wayne to serve Westland and Garden City, raised \$7,840 and 120.6 per cent of its assigned quota.

Paul Bergmeyer is Unit 2 fund-raising chairman and Division 14 leader is J. Tigue, both of Ford Motor Co.

Division 22 in Plymouth, assigned to Unit 3, collected \$5,715 or 106 per cent of quota. Division leader is R.C. Hayman of Western Electric Co., who supervised money-raising for Plymouth-Northville area, and unit chairman is L.B. Bornhauser of Chrysler Corp.

Division 23 in Livonia, also a Unit 3 group, collected \$3,650, which was 100 per cent of quota. Division leader for Livonia is J. Harris of Ford Motor Co.

Division 21 in Ann Arbor, Unit 3, collected \$9,207, or seven per cent below quota. Division Six, in Birmingham, Unit One, raised \$8,087 or 101 per cent of quota. Unit One chairman is F.J. McDonald of General Motors Corp.

Division Seven in Pontiac, Unit 1, raised \$17,864 or 112 per cent of quota. Division

Forbes also voted against the bill, he said, because the clause disallowing religious discrimination was struck from the bill.

He gave support to reintroducing the amendment as a separate bill for consideration.

Rep. Charles Harrison (D-Pontiac), who originally proposed the amendment, said he would reintroduce it as a bill because of the close vote.

The Liquor Control Commission can now refuse new licenses to clubs which practice racial discrimination but cannot refuse to renew licenses on the same grounds. Passage of the Harrison proposal would allow the LCC to deny license when renewals are considered every year in May.
