Burning Of Fields Not Sound Practice

Farmers who burn over fields, coodlots, marsh areas and fence Farmers who burn over iteids, woodlots, marsh areas and fence row covers are really "playing with fire" according to Charles Shick of the Michigan Department of Con-servation and the Cooperative Ex-tension Service of Michigan State

servictor and service of Michigan State College destroy humus which is vital to soil. In instances, fences are ruined and young seedlings in woodlots are killed. Burning also eliminates food and mesting cover which is necessary to ground nesting birds and animals. "Under ordinary conditions a fire is an agricultural liability, but if fire must be used, burning should be carried on early in the spring before birds have started nesting." Shick warns. Some pheasants and quall start nesting shortly after the first of April.


