TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN ZONING AMENDATORY ORDINANCE NO. 29-122

An Ordinance to amend the Zoning Ordinance No. 29 of the Township of Farmington, as amended.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN:

Section 1. That the Zoning Map of said Ordinance No. 29 of the Township of Farmington, as amended, be amended by Ordinance 29-122 and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: 1. A lot located in the B-2 district is now shown in the area described in the following description:

That part of the E. 1/2 of the NW 1/4 of Section 7, T. 1 N., R. 3 E., Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, described as beginning at a point in the S. line of Section 7 to distant 30.00 feet, 30' 0" N. 52° 50' 00" W. from the N. 1/2 corner, thence S. 61° 00' 00" W. along the W. line of Glen Ave. Subdivision 60.00 ft. to a point, thence S. 52° 50' 00" W. 20' 00" along a line N. of the parallel with the N. 1/2 line of Glen Ave. Subdivision 60.00 ft. to a point, thence S. 61° 00' 00" W. along the E. 1/2 line of said parcel of land owned by Glen W. Rogers and Carolyn B. Rogers, 400 ft. 00" S. 84° 00' 00" W. 44' 00" S. 60' 00" W. along the E. 1/2 line of said parcel of land, excepting therefrom the N. 1/2 1/4 of said parcel and excepting therefrom the E. 1/2 1/4 of said parcel.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed with the exception necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect immediately.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Township Board of Trustees of Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, at a regular meeting thereof, duly called and held on the 26th day of March, 1973, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.
