## Whispering Willows Opens Course Sunday

It may be due to the fact this is an election year that Mayor Edward McNamara and some members of the Livonia City Council and then again it may be that those in charge of Whispering Willows golf club believe it will have a record year, but the fact is the course will open Sunday with no increase in greens fees.

This in spite of all pay-play links in the area boasting prices as much as 30 cents to 75 cents per round.

In announcing plans for the season, Pro Gary Whitener indicated the Parks and Recreation Commission had decided to follow the price schedule of 1972. Members may decide to review the program later in the year after seeing the response during the early weeks of the season.

The fees for residents -- (Monday through Friday) \$2.75 for nine holes and \$4 for 18 on week days; for Saturdays, Sundays and holidays -- \$3.25 for nine and \$5 for 18 holes.

For non-residents -- (Monday through Friday) \$3 for nine and \$4.50 for 18; Saturday, Sunday and holidays \$3.50 for nine and \$5.50 for 18.

Livonia residents must show identification of residency or they will be charged non-resident rates, according to Whitener.

Rates for resident senior citizens' links -- (Monday through Friday) \$1 for nine and \$2 for 18 holes, all seniors must tee off before noon.

Twilight rates, effective after 6 p.m., are \$2 for residents and \$2.25 for non-residents.

"We are looking forward to our greatest season," said Whitener. "With daylight time effective as of the end of April, folks will have additional hour or two of daylight after 6 p.m. and we're looking for hundreds to take advantage of the twilight rates."

Starting times are in effect for the weekend and holidays for Livonia residents only. A charge of 25 cents per person will be made and a Livonian may reserve times for as many as four...but only by phone in advance. No times will be reserved for those not teeing off by the course and making a personal call.

Whitener will be assisted by Tom Sheldon in teaching and operation of the course. Martha Hochberry will
