MSC TO OPEN NEW 4-YEAR NURSING COURSE THIS FALL

A new, four-year course for training professional nurses will be started by Michigan State College in September. It was announced by Lloyd C. Emmons, dean of MSC's School of Science and Arts.

The course, to be a combination of academic study at Michigan State and practice training in hospitals, is the result of a survey made by a special seven-man committee, headed by Dean Emmons, in consultation with hospital nursing staffs and local committees on nursing located within a 75-mile radius of East Lansing.

It will be administered by a director, a registrar, an adviser and staffs of hospitals where students will take their clinical training. The course will be offered in the Division of Biological Sciences of the School of Science and Arts, Dean Emmons said.

Named acting director of the curriculum was Prof. H. J. Staffeth, who is director of the Division of Biological Sciences. He will remain in this capacity until a full-time director is named.

Between 15 and 25 young women are expected to enter in the course this fall, Dean Emmons said. Until enrollment expands he said, two hospitals will be used for the clinical phase of the course — Edward W. Sparrow Hospital in Lansing, and Butterworth Hospital in Grand Rapids. Students will receive 140 credits for work at MSC, and 60 for clinical training. Graduates in nursing will be eligible to receive the degree of Bachelor of Science with a major in nursing.

Cooperating with MSC in setting up the new course are: the W. K. Kellogg Foundation, the National League of Nursing Education, the U. S. Public Health Service and the Michigan Board of Registration of Nurses.

Classes in all phases of Church Music will be taught at the School, including Conducting, Choral Techniques, Singers, Organists, and choir directors will assemble from New York, Coast, from Canada, Michigan and other mid-western States.

For twenty years the school has been favorably known throughout America for its high standard of Church Music Education. Famous leaders, composers, and organists have been on its faculty.

Dr. Roberta Blitgord, outstanding composer, organist and choir director, will head this season's faculty.

Professor Amos Ebersole, of the Detroit Institute of Music Art, will be on faculty. He has taught organ and group singing. Professor Robert Fountain, vocalist and director at Oberlin College, will have the choral classes. Dr. Nelle Huger Ebersole, Music Director of the Detroit Council of Churches and National Chairman of Church Music in the National Foundation of Music Clubs, will be on faculty and direct the school. Vernon Schell Huger Ebersole, the Detroit Council of Churches, will be the Youth Choir Camp Director and June Hoffrichter, of Cleveland, Ohio, will be the School Nurse.

The 20th anniversary session will feature two evenings of oratorio by Harold Haugh, tenor, of the University of Michigan faculty. A choral methods clinic will be conducted by Dr. Henry Veldt, of the Oberlin College Choir.
