# Gwen Frostic Visits Farmington

Gwen Frostic, famed for her artistic translations of nature's beauties, will speak in Farmington High School at 8 p.m. Wednesday, April 11.

The Farmington Area Naturalists, the American Association of University Women and the Wesleyan Guild of the First United Methodist Church of Farmington will sponsor her talk.

It is free and open to the public. The school is located at 32000 Shiawassee, between Powers and Orchard Lake Road.

Miss Frostic makes her homes in a wilderness area near Frankfort in northern

Michigan. She sketches the countless varieties of wild life she finds outside her door, and her drawings are produced as note paper and other products.

An appreciator of nature long before ecology was a household word, Miss Frostic also describes her world in poetry.

"My job," she has said, "is not to educate but to help people feel the beauty of nature."

"I don't tell of the destruction of Lake Erie because everyone knows that. I try to get them to feel the need for beauty and the need for everything to live in order that we may live."

"This is more basic," her sketches, which she makes from careful observation are produced by Presscraft Papers, a printing plant she operates. It is a popular tourist attraction in the Frankfort and Benzonia area.

Miss Frostic will be introduced by Dr. Robert Douglass of Farmington, who played a large role in organizing the Farmington Naturalists two years ago.
