"Take It Easy"
Health Dept. Says

Take it easy; these are heat and sunstroke days, the Michigan Department of Health warned today.

People past their middle years, those with high blood pressure, diseases of the heart, circulatory system or kidneys, fat people and alcoholics are more in danger than others. Over-exertion, excessive sweating, over-eating, over-drinking, worry, fatigue, anger and lack of sleep add to the danger.

To avoid heat prostration or sunstroke, the Department recommends:

Avoid prolonged exposure to sun and excessive heat — this includes ball games, tent-shows, fair midway, streets, lawn, garden, bench, or boat.

Keep your head covered when exposed to direct sunlight. Wear loose, light, porous clothing. Stay where there is a circulation of air. Avoid over-exertion and fatigue. Take recreation such as golf, shuffleboard, rowing, hiking, swimming and tennis in small doses. Do your lawn mowing and light gardening in brief periods the cooler part of the day. Stop either work or play if you begin to feel ill effects from heat or sun.

Eat the same protective foods you eat the year around — milk, fruits, vegetables, meat, eggs — but cut down on fried foods, gravies, rich salad dressings and rich desserts. Cook less. Eat more raw vegetables and fruits. Dip your radishes, carrot sticks, celery and green onions in iodized salt to increase your salt intake. Have one hot food or beverage to make your meal more satisfying.

Drink right to twelve glasses of liquid a day — this includes water, fruit juices, milk, soup, tea and coffee.

Get a good night's rest. Nap or rest in the early afternoon.

Keep a calm, pleasant attitude of mind. Save your worries for cooler days.

State Park Attendance
Shows Decline in 1950

A general drop from the 1949 record breaking attendance at state parks and recreation areas so far this season is reflected in conservation department reports of seven parks among those ordinarily drawing the highest number of visitors.

Cold weather apparently has discouraged regular users and campers, parks division officials say. Records available for the season so far show a tally of 661,375 visitors at Grand Haven as compared with 800,350 for the comparative 1949 period; 473,169 at Holland, 799,056 in 1949; 363,780 at Sterling, 424,140 in 1949; 352,045 at Dodge No. 1 at Cass Lake, 628,503 in 1949; 110,101 at Ludington, 120,382 in 1949; 83,265 at Lakeport near Port Huron, 169,605 in 1949; 60,764 at Pontiac Lake, 96,392 in 1949.

Reports indicate picnickers and daily users are "discovering" previously little- patronized or smaller parks.

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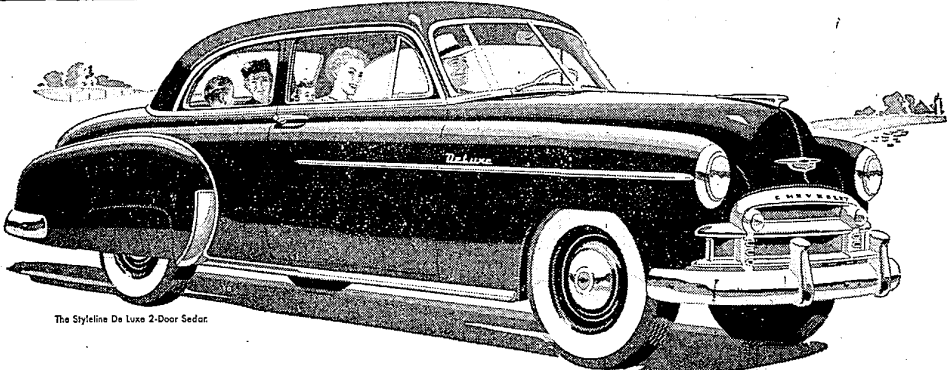
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
