Engagement Announced

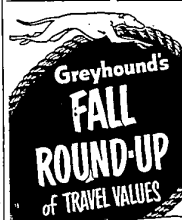

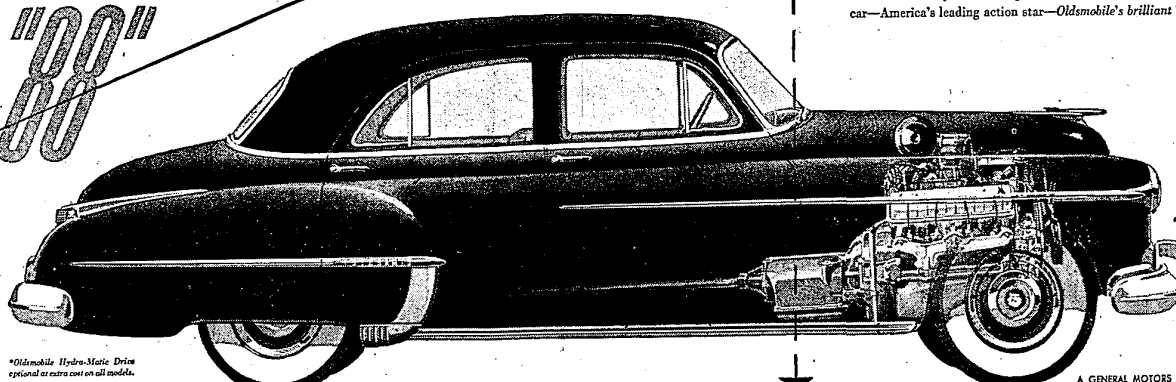
