The tender, however, doesn't assure Novi firemen they won't run out of water when fighting fire. It would take several tenders to keep a pumper supplied with water — the pumper can empty its tanks against a fire as quickly as the tender can fill them. But it does carry a lot of water in a hurry.

And Novi, with only one truck to fight fire with, uses it to good advantage. Its fire fighting truck uses a solid stream to extinguish fires, rather than the newer "fog" system. Novi firemen claim the solid stream is better for big blazes, the fog better for smoky fires. Fog, however, uses much less water than a solid stream, so Novi firemen have a great need for a reliable water supply when fighting a blaze. And with their trusty '28 Reo, they have it.
