 Twelve entries from North Farmington High School took top honors with first division ratings at the state solo and ensemble festival at Schoolcraft College.

Ten other entries won second division ratings and two placed in the third division.

Soloists grades No. 1 were Ron Kendall, trombone; Robbin Ryan, flute; Archie Black, clarinet; Karen Benden, flute; Gail Greenwald, flute, and Cindy Berry, clarinet.

No. 1 ratings also went to Jan Benden for a bass clarinet solo; a woodwind quintet of Chris Arvidson on flute, Cindy Lestikow on clarinet, Rick Wallace on horn, Phyllis Hughes on oboe and Frances Hughes on bassoon; and a mixed clarinet quartet with Linda Ferriss, Cindy Berry, and Debbie and Jan-Benden.

In earlier competition, No. 1 ratings were won by three North Farmington choral groups and the 77 piece symphony band. Five ensembles also qualified for state competition. The choral groups are the Northern Choral, The Norsemen (men's glee club) and Women's Choral.

Dunckel Junior High music students who received No. 1 ratings in district competition were Jean Schumacher and Nancy Stamy for individual flute solos and together as a flute duet, and David Kaye for a clarinet solo.

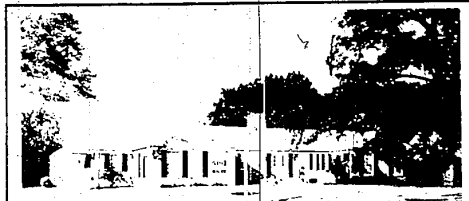
