## UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN STUDIES "HOW TO KEEP HEALTHY" STUDY

Medical science is now studying the process of maintaining health with the aim of an auto mechanic checking the worn out parts of a motor.

Research centering around the Institute of Industrial Health at the University of Michigan is aimed at finding the changes that occur in a person during the span of life, under stress as well as normal conditions, and what these changes do to the human body.

Dr. Otto T. Mallory, Jr., director of the Institute, explained that the main interest centers around changes that indicate a trend away from health. Armed with this knowledge there may be a chance to prevent the disease by preventing its development.

Periodic health examinations, he pointed out, that would lead to the recognition of such changes would give the medical practitioner advantage of the situation, and he could act to maintain a patient's health.

Any motorist would have the mechanical parts of his automobile repaired before he made a trip if he knew in advance what parts were likely to fail and the same token applies to the human body.

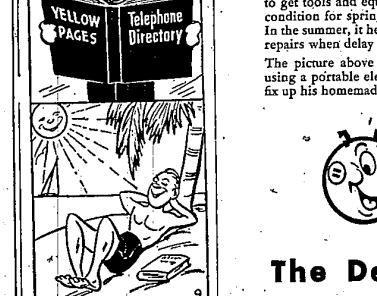
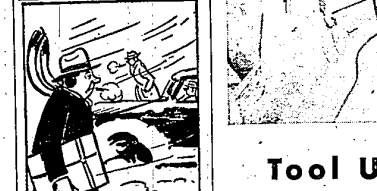

By thing the Democrats have to fear was that this was the same treatment given Krug and Leary Johnson. Furthermore the McGrath resignation story was followed by a press conference at which the President bluntly refused to comment in the report that McGrath was to go.

All that day, newsmen tried to phone McGrath. Ordinarily easy to reach, he kept ominous silence. However, he was not idle.

Overnight he hauled up two of his biggest guns. One was Cardinal Spellman, who sent a message from Tokyo.

The other was his 54-year-old law partner, Senator Francis Green of Rhode Island.

Meanwhile, Matt Connelly, though ordinarily lukewarm toward AG and in favor of appointing Judge Tom Murphy of New York to head a corruption commission, went to McGrath's defense.

That was when the President at the next cabinet meeting suddenly reversed himself, told the surprised cabinet and the surprised McGrath that with the beginning of the new year he wanted them to know that despite the press attack on his attorney general, he was keeping them all on.

Prime Minister Churchill was getting a progress report on the Anglo-American military discussions from his friend and military observer, Field Marshal Sir William Slim.

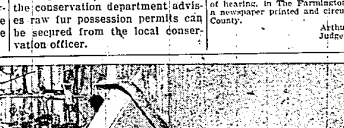
