sliced mushrooms, liquid and mayonnaise. Mix with macaroni in baking dish or casserole. Top with grated cheese. Bake 25 minutes at 425 degrees.

MANICOTTI

1 1/2 lb. lasagne noodles, cooked
1 lb. ricotta cheese
1 T. parsley
2 eggs, hard cooked and chopped
1 large jar meatless spaghetti sauce
1 c. grated parmesan cheese.

Cut each lasagne noodle into three parts. Mix ricotta cheese with parsley and chopped egg. With fingers, form cheese mixture into logs, about a half-inch in diameter and the length of the noodles' width. Wrap the piece of noodle around the cheese roll and place in buttered baking dish. When all are rolled, cover with spaghetti sauce and top with parmesan. Bake for 25 minutes in 325-degree oven. Serves six.

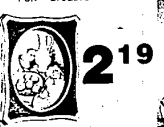

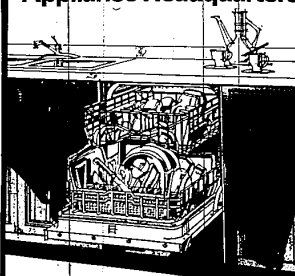
