Pfc. Robert L. Lussenden of Farmington has been assigned to the Michigan 929th Air Force Reserve Training Wing. The announcement was made this week by Lt. Col. William E. Hinton, Commanding Officer of the Wing.

Pfc. Lussenden, employed as a plumber's helper, will report to Selfridge Air Force Base one week end per month for intensive on-the-job training with the Wing. For each two days he will receive four days pay, and earn points toward promotion, retention, and eventual retirement with pay from the Air Force Reserve.

Born in Flint 21 years ago, Pfc. Lussenden attended Farmington High School and was graduated in 1936. He and his wife Josephine and their two-month-old son are presently residing at 2918 E. Eldred.

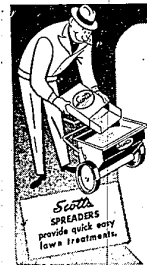
