Members present were Walter Christensen, Student Council president; Ralph Gault, Junior Class president; Betty Gourlay, Sophomore Class president; Bob Grose, Freshman Class president; Don Hartford, Senior Student Council representative; Glen Evans, Junior Student Council representative; Richard Robenault, Freshman Student Council representative; Mr. Louis Schmidt, superintendent of schools, acting as chairman; Ellis Grace, Sophomore Student Council representative, and Douglas Gault, Senior Class president. "Were the only members absent."

The general ideas of the committee as well as an introduction to the scope of the activities of the committee was given by Mr. Louis Schmidt.

This was followed by a discussion of the terms of membership. It was decided by the committee to enlarge the committee to the number of students and faculty advisors. It was decided that the 7th and 8th grades would be allowed to send their class president and one Student Council representative from each class, raising the membership to 14. Hank Albers was one of the sixty catchers who were chosen for the traveling baseball team in the Air Force.

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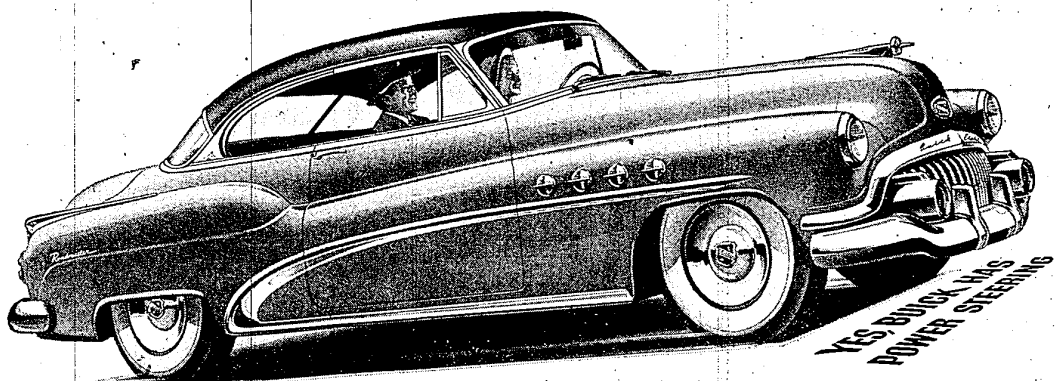
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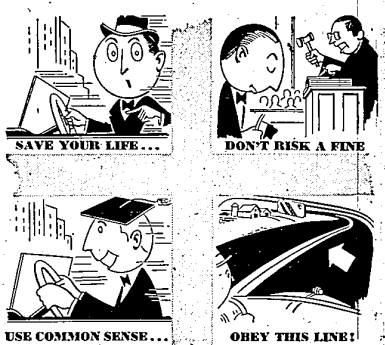
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
