DISCOVER ANTHRAX DISEASE AFFECTS MICHIGAN ANIMALS

In recent months, Anthrax, a disease of cattle and swine, has developed in a number of mid-western states and a few such have been located on farms in the counties of Hillsdale, Wayne, Shiawassee, St. Joseph, Kalamazoo, Berrien and Oceana, reports Director Charles Flyg, Michigan Department of Agriculture.

It urges all farmers having livestock appearing sick to report them to a veterinarian or Dr. Leo Davidson, State Veterinarian, immediately.

Anthrax is an infectious and communicable disease to all types of animals and humans. Therefore, everyone is warned not to handle the sick animals. Furthermore, do not handle animals that have died until proper arrangements are made regarding the disposal of the carcasses.

All rendering plants will be informed that they will not be permitted to move any dead animals until a certificate has been obtained from a local veterinarian stating the cause of the death of the animal.

It has been reported that Anthrax has been found in supplies of bone meal shipped to the United States from outside the country. Every effort will be made by the Michigan Department of Agriculture cooperating with the Federal Bureau of Animal Industry to determine the cause of Anthrax in Michigan and to stop its spread.

Wheat Fields In State May Need Extra Nitrogen For Better Yield

If you would like to increase your wheat yield by three to 14 bushels to the acre with a cash outlay of not more than \$3.50, you'll be interested in this tip from E. D. Longnecker, extension soil scientist at Michigan State College.

Longnecker points out that fall-seeded wheat and rye frequently need extra nitrogen in the early spring. Until the soil becomes thoroughly warmed, neither the organic matter of the soil nor the complete fertilizer applied at seeding time may be able to furnish all the nitrogen needed by the growing plants.

When extra nitrogen is needed, 20 pounds of actual nitrogen to the acre is about the right amount. This can be supplied by 100 pounds

of ammonium sulfate, 65 pounds of ammonium nitrate or 50 pounds of urea, Uramon or NuGreen. Although early applications made as soon as the ground is firm have proved most successful, applications made the first week of May have resulted in profitable increases in yield. The fertilizer may be applied with a grain drill, horizontal hopper-type lime or fertilizer spreader, or by hand. It can be spread and left on the surface since it will dissolve with a couple of heavy dews or a light rain.

Longnecker says you can spot a shortage of nitrogen in the grain crop by a lack of adequate stooling and a light green leaf color. Later leaves turn yellow and growth is slow and unsatisfactory. You can confirm a lack of nitrogen by a tissue test. Materials and instructions for making the nitrogen tissue test may be obtained from your county agricultural agent.

If an application of manure was made to the field before planting or used as a winter topdressing, extra nitrogen won't be needed at this time. Likewise, if a good clover or alfalfa sod was plowed down for the fall-seeded grain, do not topdress with nitrogen this spring.

Seeding Important In Pasture Crop

Getting a good seeding of hay and pasture crops is one of the jobs facing many Michigan farmers now and Richard Bell, farm crops specialist at Michigan State College, passes along some tips for insuring success in the venture.

Bell says that one of the most important points is to test the soil for acidity if you are making an alfalfa seeding and the soil hasn't been tested recently. That job must be done immediately so you can get the results of the test and get the limestone applied.

Pulverized or super-fine limestone will correct the acidity more rapidly. The lime should be applied and worked into the soil either before or after plowing. Inoculate alfalfa seed regardless of how recently alfalfa has been grown on the same land. Put the alfalfa seed in shallow by so the seed falls behind the drill. Then cut-pick or let the first rain cover the seed.

A good seeding mixture for moderately to well-drained fields is six to eight pounds of alfalfa, one fourth to one half pound of ladino clover, and four to four pounds of bromegrass per acre.

At planting time, apply at least 300 to 350 pounds of fertilizer of an analysis like 4-16-16 or 3-15-9, or 450 to 500 pounds of a lower analysis such as 3-12-12 or 2-12-16. For sandy soils, Bell recommends at least 300 to 350 pounds of 3-9-18.

Apply Lime To Lawn Only When Tests Show Need

Lime should not be applied unless a soil test shows that there is need for it. There are very few lawns that need lime. Furthermore, there is a danger of over-liming because grass grows best as do other Michigan plants, on slightly acid soil, reports William E. Bosterman, assistant county agricultural agent.

Lawn fertilizers should contain a large portion of nitrogen, the plant food element which stimulates the production of the green, leafy portion of plants.

The fertilizer which is recommended for all general turf growing has a 10-6-4 analysis. The first figure is per cent of nitrogen, the second per cent of available phosphoric acid and the third per cent of water soluble potash. A general recommendation is to apply ten pounds of 10-6-4 per 1,000 square feet in early spring.

Inspections Necessary On Farm Seeds If Sold

Farmers are reminded that any agricultural seeds offered for sale must be tested for purity and germination and carry a tag or label showing such purity and germination and other legal information as is required by law.

The only exemption to the requirements of the law is the movement of home-grown seeds between farms.

Agricultural seeds advertised for sale or sold through public auction sales are not exempt from the provisions of the law and must be treated for both purity and germination and carry the legally required tag.

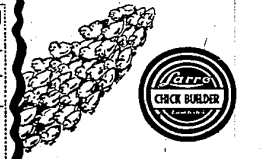
