Council Candidate Sues Ex-Farmington Manager

FARMINGTON A candidate for the proposed Farmington Hills Council, Melvin Paunovich, has sued former Farmington City Manager John D. Dinan and another man for \$30,000, claiming they beat him without provocation last December.

Paunovich, a Southfield police corporal, said the incident happened last Dec. 1 in a Telegraph Road tavern as he was on a routine liquor patrol assignment.

Named as co-defendant with Dinan, now a member of the Farmington Library Board, is Louis B. Deziel of Bingham Farms. Dinan and Deziel are business partners. Paunovich's attorney, Sheldon Larky, said the com-

plaintain and his partner, Pit. Duane S. Zumlinski, were driving past the tavern when the manager motioned them inside. Larky said the manager told the officers: two customers were using profanity and causing a disturbance.

The officers, both in plain-clothes, sat at the bar to observe Dinan and Deziel, Larky said.

When Dinan, who had left the bar momentarily, returned, Deziel claimed Pau-novich had taken Dinan's seat, grabbed him by the collar and began choking him, the attorney said. A fight began in which Dinan allegedly joined.

Dinan and Deziel were arrested and held overnight in the Southfield police lockup. They were arraigned the following day before 48th District Judge Norman W. Feder on charges of assault and battery and disorderly conduct. Both stood mute and were released for pre-trial examination April 25.

John I. Bain, attorney for Dinan and Deziel, declined comment on either the criminal charges or damage suit.

The damage suit alleges Dinan and Deziel "ripped and destroyed" Pau-novich's clothes and attacked him with "malice and intent to maim." Paunovich also claimed in the suit that he suffered bruises on his head, body, back, hands, arms and legs and pain and discomfort.

Paunovich's wife, Carol, a
