Mr. and Mrs. Sofus Persson and daughter Hazel of Filmore Avenue were Sunday guests of friends in Detroit.

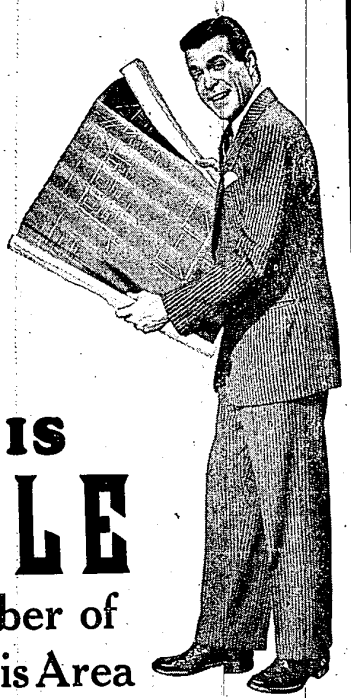
Mrs. William Barrett of Irving Avenue attended a Gold Star meeting in Detroit Tuesday.
