### Burch To Run For Prosecutor

L. C. Burch, Jr., Pontiac attorney, filed his petitions and announced his candidacy Tuesday for the Democratic nomination for Prosecutor of Oakland County.

Burch has lived and practiced law in Pontiac since his graduation from the University of Michigan Law School in 1919, having been president of his class there. He is a former Public Administrator of Oakland County, and a member of the Bars of Michigan, Georgia and the Federal District Courts.

Burch served in the U. S. Navy from 1942 to 1946, attaining the rank of Lieutenant-Commander, having received his naval training at the Harvard Business School and George Washington University. He is presently a member of the Voluntary Law Unit of the Naval Reserve in Pontiac. During World War II he served in the South Pacific, having been attached to the Third Marine Division through the battles of the Solomon Islands.

Burch, who lives at 219 Eileen in Pontiac, is 31 years of age, is married and has two sons. He is president of the Gridiron Club of Pontiac, a member of the Pontiac Knights of Pythias Lodge 19, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and a member of the official board of Central Methodist Church.
