TWO TO ATTEND FRED WARING WORKSHOP AT MSC

Lloyd H. Smith, Jr., Farmington High School music teacher, of 2611 Brookdale, and Jeanne Livingston Wells, music supervisor of Farmington Township Schools, will be among the 300 persons from Michigan and other Midwestern states who will take part in the Fred Waring Choral Workshop to be held at Michigan State College July 21-25.

The workshop will be directed by Waring with the help of several of his famous "Pennywhinnies" staff members. It will consist of about 40 hours of "classroom" work designed for choral directors, music directors, church choir directors and amateur musicians. Areas covered will include choral techniques, program building, rehearsal procedures and problems of balance and arrangement.

 Jens Jensen of 20960 Sunnydale Avenue, Farmington, died suddenly following a heart attack on Thursday afternoon on May 1, 1952, at his home.

Mr. Jensen was born July 12, 1874, in Denmark, the son of Kriston and Ann Brackmann Jensen. He attended school in Denmark and took up the trade of wagon making. He was united in marriage on May 4, 1909, to Miss Kristine Kolstrup. Mr. and Mrs. Jensen came to this country in 1916, and he was employed by the Ford Motor Company as a body maker until his retirement.

Mr. Jensen was a member of the St. Peter's Danish Lutheran Church in Detroit, a member of the Danish Brotherhood No. 227 and the Fremad R. V. O. in Detroit.

Thirty-Two Building Permits Total \$172,550 in Estimated Valuation

Thirty-two building permits totaling \$172,550 in estimated valuation were issued by Farmington Township Building Inspector Thomas Tardy and City Manager James Tennant from June 23 through June 13. Two permits totaling \$2,000 in estimated valuation were issued in the city while 30 permits totaling \$170,550 in estimated valuation were issued at the township office.

The figures compare with 55 permits totaling \$321,213 for the entire month of May. Breakdown of the May permits was nine for the city valued at \$42,100 and 46 in the township totaling \$259,113.

EXPECT LARGE TURNOUT AT START OF BASS SEASON

Thousands of fishermen will be on Michigan lakes and rivers on the June 21 opening week end of bass season, including the strictly bass fishing fans and the vacationists and others taking the occasion to toss out a line for the first time this year.

By the end of June, the conservation department estimates that some 750,000 persons will have wet a line at least once this year. . . out of the 1,200,000 who will buy angling licenses in 1952.

With small-mouth and large-mouth bass legal, and general and trout seasons already well under way, every fish found in state waters can be taken. General and trout seasons opened together on April 26 where as in recent years the general season lidlifter was delayed until June.

Small-mouth and large-mouth bass rated are unchanged; maximum per day or in possession from inland lakes and streams is five singly or in any combination including northern pike and walleyes taken. On Great Lakes and connecting waters, Lake St. Clair and St. Clair, St. Marys and Detroit rivers, maximum is a collective total of 10 bass, northern pike and walleyes, except that not more than five may be bass and not more than five may be northern pike. Minimum size limit on black bass, any waters, is ten inches.
