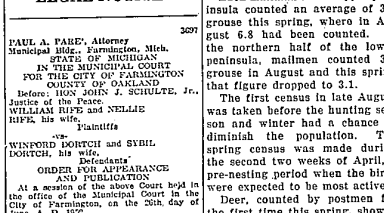
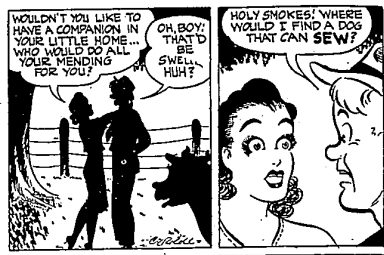


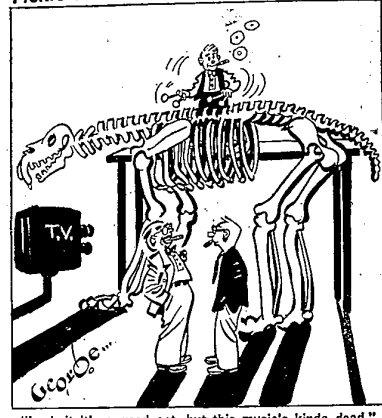

## June Bounty Payments Drop 50% Under May

Bounty payments in June dropped more than 50 per cent from May, with \$9,490 being paid to hunters and trappers for foxes, coyotes and bobcats. No wolves were bountied in June.

Michigan paid \$9,340 for 1,658 foxes, \$1,050 for 60 coyotes, and \$100 for 20 bobcats.

All these totals represented drops from May totals when \$20,819 was paid out for 3,705 foxes, 126 coyotes and 32 bobcats.

## SPRING RUFFED GROUSE COUNT SHOWS DROP

The first spring rural mail carrier count of ruffed grouse, just completed by the conservation department, shows a drop from the census taken last August.

George A. Ammann, department specialist on grouse, cautioned, however, on interpreting results of this first spring survey. He said the mail carrier count will be used more as a guide in the future than for determining present populations.

Each mailman in the upper peninsula counted an average of 3.6 grouse this spring, where in August 6.8 had been counted. In the northern half of the lower peninsula, mailmen counted 3.2 grouse in August and this spring that figure dropped to 3.1.

The first census in late August was taken before the hunting season and winter had a chance to diminish the population. The spring census was made during the second two weeks of April, a pre-nesting period when the birds were expected to be most active.

was Franco who took the initiative in wanting American cash and there seemed to be nothing he wouldn't do to get it.

Now, however, he is just the opposite. He wants American dollars to be spent in Spain only on his own terms.

Specifically, the difference with Franco boils down to the fact that the U. S. Navy and Air Force want bases in Spain, while Franco wants modern military equipment for the Spanish army.

However, the tanks and heavy armor which he demands happen to be the things which the U. S. Army is short of. Priority on this equipment goes first to Korea, second to U. S. forces in this country, third to NATO allies in West Europe. Defense officials argue that to give Franco modern army equipment before we send it to France, Italy, Belgium, and other non-fascist allies would be a fiasco in Western Europe. We are already far behind in our promises to them.

Furthermore, defense officials point out that they aren't much interested in the Spanish army anyway. Located on the southern tip of end of Europe, it would be of no help in stopping the onrush of the Red army over France and Belgium to the English Channel. What they are interested in instead is air and naval bases in Spain. And regarding these, Franco now seems much less enthusiastic.

France hasn't said it in so many words, but he seems to want the latest \$100,000,000 voted by congress more or less with no strings attached.

ANOTHER RUSSIAN ATTACK?

The Air Force fears that the B-29 that crashed into the Japanese sea some time ago may have been shot down by the Russians.

Inside story is that the plane was on a weather reconnaissance mission along the Siberian coast. No radio report was received that it was in trouble. It just mysteriously disappeared. It may have flown too near the Siberian coast to suit the Russians, and jet fighters as they did the Swedish plane over the Baltic.
