## ACCIDENTS OCCUR ON ONE IN FOUR MICHIGAN FARMS

"One of every four farms in Michigan will be the scene of a disabling accident during the next twelve months," according to David Steinicke, farm safety specialist at Michigan State College.

He made the prediction this week in announcing Farm Safety Week, July 29 to 31. "Although farmers throughout the nation will be eliminating hazards on their farms during that week, safety must be a 365-day-a-year job if we are to cut the toll of farm accidents in the state," he added.

Many people do not realize how high and serious the toll is, Steinicke said. The average cost of a farm accident involving a fall is nearly \$50, for instance. And the average fall costs the farmer 24 days lost from farm work. Average farm machine accidents cost \$60 in medical expenses and 24 days lost from farm work.
