Orchard Ridge Gaslites Mean Fun For All

Carnival rides, games, booths and concerts are among the attractions planned for the first "Gaslite Festival" on the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland Community College. In an attempt to acquaint the public with the Farmington campus, several events have been scheduled the weekend of May 11 to 13. The campus is located at 1-ops between Farmington and Orchard Lake Rds. All mothers accompanied by their families are entitled to a free pancake breakfast on Mother's Day morning. Blue grass music will "serenade" the families. The college's buildings will be open from 2 to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday for public view. Visitors can ask faculty members and students stationed throughout the buildings for information. Admissions officials and counselors will also have information available. "The main reason we are doing this is to let the community know about our campus and the presence of our campus in the community," Dean of Students Don Nichols said. "We believe we can serve all segments of our community and they should know of our existence," he said, noting that facilities such as the library are available. Any proceeds from the weekend will go toward student scholarships and the child play center. The scholarships will be awarded solely for excellence in studies.

Esch, Ford Fight Mouillee Project

U.S. Reps. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) and William Ford (D-Taylor) have urged three federal agencies to disapprove of the Army Corps of Engineers' proposed polluted dredge project at Pointe Mouillee on Lake Erie. The congressmen stated the project would do "irreparable damage" in letters to the Environmental Protection Agency, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife and the corps.

"It is our understanding that as a result of recent discussions in Washington, your agency has been asked to join with other federal agencies in a re-examination of the proposed Pointe Mouillee disposal project," he said.

"These marshlands have suffered extensive encroachment already and are being further reduced by the erosive action of high water. The prevention of any further unnecessary reduction of the marshland should be a prime objective of the federal officials responsible for preserving the environment."

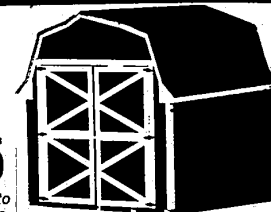

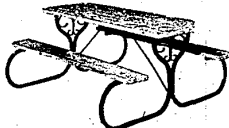

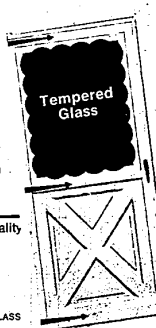
