Start Gov't Research Of State Waterways

A 10-year study of Michigan lakes and river systems, the first major research project financed with U. S. Dingle-Johnson act funds, has received federal approval, the conservation department discloses.

Preliminary work has started and the big project will be well underway by mid-August. About 60 lakes and seven river systems are on the investigation schedule the first year and the ultimate aim is to cover all the waters of the state, says A. B. Cook, Jr., assistant fish division chief who is in charge of the program. Many waters already have been inventoried independently by the department.
