BLOOD QUOTA SET AT 11.351 PINTS FOR COUNTY

Volunteers will strive to fill 11.351 pint bottles with life-saving plasma in temporary clinics around Oakland County during the next twelve months.

The County's quota of 11,351, about one-eighth of the \$9-100 pint quota for the Wayne-Oakland-Macomb-St. Clair area served by Detroit Regional Blood Center, was announced this week by the American Red Cross.

"It just one person from every two or three households would give a pint of blood during the year, we would more than make our goal," Mrs. John D. Monroe of Pontiac, Blood Program Chairman for Oakland County Red Cross Chapter, said. Wounded men in the armed forces will need 5,692 pints of temporary clinics around Oakland County. Chapter officials have figured quotas for the county's various areas according to population. The figures represent roughly .02 pints of blood per person.

Lightning Bolt Hits Bathhouse At Park

A bolt of lightning woke up Sleeper State Park with quite a jolt.

During a storm, electricity hit the park bathhouse and caused considerable damage. The roof was split by the shock, electrical fixtures were burned out, doors and windows were damaged and sliding and shower room walls were split.

Patrols from the 7th are battling the Reds in the strategic Iron Triangle sector near Khumwa, while tank and artillery guns pound at deeply entrenched enemy fortifications.

Private Schmidt, an ambulance driver in the 7th Medical Battalion, entered the Army in August of 1950. He arrived in Korea last June.

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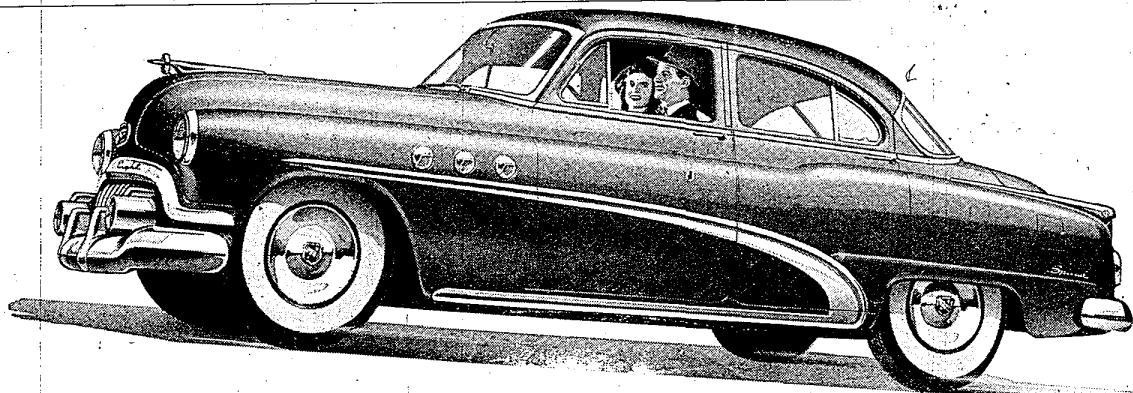
