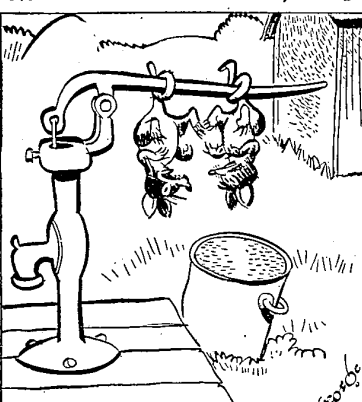

vote, Moody, with the support of Senator Styles Bridges, Republican, New Hampshire, and his friends Long and McNamara, telephoned more than half the members of the senate and got their approval.

The foxhole rider still had to pass the house, where Congressmen George Mahon of Texas and Dan Flood of Pennsylvania, members of the joint committee on military appropriations, were in the house. At first they failed. In the privacy of the committee, the vote went against them.

However, the friends of the G. I. did not stop.

They enlisted the help of majority leader John McCormack of Massachusetts, Alfred Sieminski of New Jersey, a Korean veteran, Louis Blanton and Thaddeus Blackerowicz of Detroit, all Democrats; Mrs. Edith Nourse Rogers of Massachusetts, Republican. They threatened to carry the fight to the floor of the House where every congressman would have to stand up and vote for or against the G. I.'s.

This latest, plus the astute leadership of Moody and the final support of Senator O'Mahoney of Wyoming, finally put the combat bonus bill through. It is now a matter of law, and checks to G. I.'s should be in the mail fairly soon.

PLAN AERIAL SPRAY OF 400 ACRES OF FOREST

The conservation department plans to aerial spray some 400 acres in the Black Lake state forest in order to curb a Saratoga spruce beetle infestation.

So far about 20 acres of trees in the Black Lake state forest have died or will not recover, reports Richard Fox, department forest entomologist.

Spraying should be done now, Fox says, since the adult beetles are out and will be laying eggs within the next ten days. An oil solution of DDT will be sprayed on these bugs which prefer the red and black spruce.

A sucking insect in the adult stage, the spruce beetle pierces and injures the bark of branches. A healing resin may form around the punctures but if they are frequent enough killing of the tree results. In the nymphal stage the bug is dependent on an alternate host to survive, which usually is the sweetfern plant.

Small infestation was first detected in 1949.

Large Brown Trout Died From "Indigestion"

The brown trout recently taken out of Ogemaw county's Houghton creek may well be a new state sport fishing record, but the office wall at the Marquette fish hatchery is displaying a bigger Michigan specimen.

Known as "Queenie," the 24-pound brown trout at the conservation department hatchery died of suffocation in attempting to swallow a large frog back in 1939. Age at the time was estimated at 13 to 14 years. Queenie originally was a wild trout taken from Cherry creek, Marquette county.

Harold Crawford of Cass city caught a 17-pound and five-ounce brown on Houghton creek, topping a sport fishing record on Michigan brown which had held for 12 years.
