It's Labor Day and we git a holiday! Don't fergit to gitcher extra loaf of bread. You know you can always give the family a sandwich if there aint nothin' else in the house — but don't plan on us 'cause we aint gonna be here Monday. If yuh want somethin' around fer this sandwich there's always hot dogs and hamburgers. Now fer the hot dogs we got some skinless jobs fer 53c alb. and if the hamburgers are made from our fresh ground beef fer 59c a lb. you know they're good. Then there's bacon and tomatoes slung together between two hunks of bread. Fer really good flavored bacon use our own hickory smoked fer 69c a lb. Course now you can have ham! Do you want a little piece or a dig piece or a canned one? We got 'em all'sizes and shapes. The shank end of a ham is 53c a lb. — the butt end is 65c a lb. — and the pre-cooked canned hams are 89c a lb. They weigh from 10 to 12 lbs. Fer cold slicin' sling a hunk a cheese on it and yuh really got somethin'. We have some Pinconning sharp cheese fer 69c a lb. The bossman sez this even makes good rat bait — it'll draw 'em fer miles — but it's much too good fer rats — doncha think?

Now it's cooler are you gonna start bakin' yer own bread? We got a wagon box full of Pillsbury's flour and we'd jest as soon only have half a wagon box full so we'll letcha have 5\lbs. of it fer \$2.09. Course with hot bread fer lunch yuh don't need much else. Now how about a bowl or 3 of tomater soup. You can git 3 cans of Campbells tomater soup fer 29c. If yuh want a little somethin' fer dessert we got some of the best canned peaches yuh ever tasted. Once yuh taste 'em we'll bet yuh aint gonna bother about cannin' any. These are Defiance Shaggyripe peaches — made from tree-ripened freestone Elberta peaches. Now then, yuh can git 6 cans of these fer \$2.40 — or 12 cans fer \$4.75. If-yuh wann git a case we'll even sell yuh that as long as we got 'em fer \$9.50. If you'd figger yer time and yer jars and yer heat and everything you can't even can 'em that cheap — then they might spoil, too — aint that a cheery thought? Now that we've saved all that time cannin' let's have some fried chicken and green corn. We'll have fresh dressed spring chickens ready fer the skillet fer 50c a lb. — and fresh green corn fer 35c a dozen. This green corn is the super-duper kind that Jim Lapham raises that we toldcha about a couple weeks ago. Yuh should be quite a mess now after eatin' fried chicken and green corn — are yuh? Well, don't fergit there's 2 boxes of 300 count Kleenex fer 49c right here.
