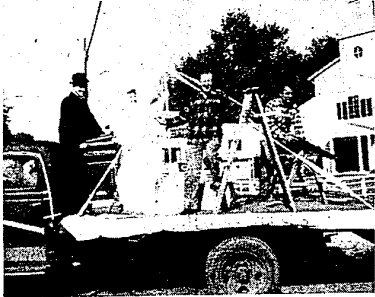

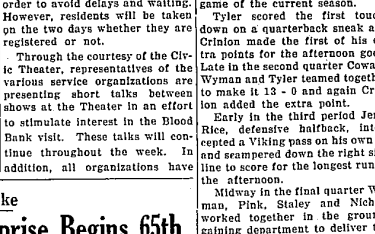
According to Township and City officials the unexpected number of new registrations is largely due to the work done by the Farmington Junior Chamber of Commerce. Members of the organization checked the registration list.
