SIZE OF CROP, INCOME MAKE APPLE PRICES

Two items influence three-fourths of the price changes in apples from month to month, a study by L. L. Boger, Michigan State College agricultural economist reveals.

These are: 1. size of crop, and 2. income of the people in the United States.

These relationships, together with a knowledge of the historical pattern of monthly apple prices, should help growers decide whether to store their apples or sell at harvest time.

As Michigan farmers are in the harvest of the 1952 crop, they are anxiously awaiting an analysis of these two points.

Boger's study shows that on the basis of his formula, recommendations to a grower would have been to sell apples at harvest in late 1949 and store for later sale in 1950. In that 23 year period, his advice would have been sound in all but two years—1935 and 1947.

The long-time price trend of apples shows that a ten per cent increase in the size of the crop from one year to another results in an average drop of 8.8 per cent in the Michigan farm price for the product.

Michigan Turkey Festival Scheduled November 4 To 6 At Grand Rapids

The sixth annual Michigan Turkey Festival will be a real "early bird" affair.

Scheduled before Thanksgiving for the first time since its inception in 1947, the event will be November 4 through 6 at Civic Auditorium in Grand Rapids.

GRANGE HEAD LISTS PROBLEMS OF TRANSPORT

Michigan farmers were urged today to put problems besetting the transportation industry ahead of their own for the time being.

"There is no more urgent domestic problem facing us today," said W. C. Armstrong, State Grange Master, in a letter to all Pomona and subordinate Granges in Michigan.

He pointed out that while other industries have been enjoying a fair degree of prosperity the railroad earnings have been so "ridiculously" low that the rails are on the brink of nationalization.

He referred to an earlier statement by Herschel D. Newsum, National Grange Master, laying responsibility for this at the door of government regulatory policy.

In his letter, Mr. Armstrong offered a solution: "Only through legislative accomplishment of a new national transportation policy ridding our railroads of outmoded regulations which prevent them from operating as efficiently as we have a right to expect, can we be assured of increasingly better transportation under a competitive system, privately managed."

Stating that Americans spend \$50 billion a year on transportation, the Michigan farm leader said that "our entire standard of living and ability to defend our country" are dependent on transportation and that farmers cannot allow the economy to become weak through lack of attention to the ills of the transport industry.

Butterfat Shown Best For Feeding Calves

Results of recent experiments at the University of Minnesota under the direction of Dr. T. W. Gullickson have confirmed his earlier findings that dairy calves fed whole milk thrive better than calves fed skim milk with vegetable fats added in place of butter-milk.

Calves fed vegetable fats in their diet invariably died by the time they were three months old. Some who were switched to a butterfat diet before three months survived.

In studies just completed corn oil was used as the source of vegetable fat. Similar results were obtained in earlier studies using such vegetable fats as cottonseed oil, soybean oil, peanut oil and coconut oil.

State Distributes Trees For Reforestation Work

Conservation department nurseries have commenced lifting the first of some 6,000,000 young trees for shipment to private and state reforestation projects.

About 4,000,000 red, white, jack and Scotch pine from the Higgins Lake, Hardwood and Wyman nurseries will be planted this fall by farmers and other private land owners.

Nearly 1,500,000 red and jack pine seedlings will go into the State forests.

Nursery shipments probably will continue through late October, depending on weather.

All seedlings and transplant stock ordered only through the department's Lansing office, is distributed at cost and may not be resold with roots attached.
