TREAT CATTLE IN LATE FALL TO STOP LICE

Late fall is the time to treat cattle to limit lice population over the winter, reminds Ray L. James, extension specialist in entomology at Michigan State College. Lice are generally more abundant on cattle in the winter season, he explains.

The later the treating, the better the results as a general rule, according to the entomologist. If spraying is delayed too late, however, there may be a weather hazard. A warm day is best for lice control, notes James.

If spraying is done in a barn or other enclosure, animals should be turned out immediately to dry. The building, if wet, should be dried out if possible, advises James. Spraying of animals in unfavorable weather is a choice farmers must make for themselves, he cautions.

He stresses that thorough treating of animals with the spray or drench has no substitute for fall control of cattle lice.

Modern Farm Building Foils Flames



A means by which the farmer can protect his crops and machinery from the major hazard of fire is illustrated by this graphic photo. Snapped at the height of flames which razed the adjoining structure, the picture shows a Quonset building near Wells, Minn., undergoing a siege of sparks and heat from which it emerged unscathed. More than 140,000 bushels of soybeans stored in the building by Ed Frank and his sons were unharmed.

The need for using such non-combustible buildings as all-steel Quonsets for crop and machinery storage is emphasized by a National Board of Underwriters report that flames take an estimated toll of \$100,000,000 worth of property every year. A large percentage of farm fires results in total or nearly total losses because the ordinary farm structures neither contain nor resist flames, water supplies are insufficient and good fire fighting equipment is not at hand.

Feed Dry Cow Well, Says Livestock Man

Feed the dry cow well, strongly urges Charles J. Little, extension livestock specialist for Michigan State College in the upper peninsula. A cow going dry will be starting a new milking period rather than just ending one, he says. It she has the farmer's help — liberal feeding.

This feeding will provide the nutrients she needs to complete the development of a strong healthy calf, explained Little, and also will build up the cow's body reserve. Then, when it's time to start producing dairy milk, she'll do it to the limit of inherited ability, he stresses.

Little points out that breeding determines milking ability but the feed and care you give your cow causes top milk production. Feed the dry cow well, he repeats.

Meat on the hoof is worth an inspection stop-enroute to market.

Damage Cuts Wheat Prices; Specialist Advises Checkups

"Smutty" is a horrid word — but it's worse when it becomes a part of your wheat grade at the grain elevator and your check is cut for each bushel of "smutty" wheat.

Herbert R. Pettigrove of the Michigan State College farm crops department points out that no matter when wheat is damaged, the farmer loses money. Field damage from smut or sprout, or bin damage — musty, sick, weevil or rodent-hit wheat — all take discount dollars out of the farmer's pockets. Pettigrove stresses the importance of examining farm-stored grain.

Hot weather after the harvest this fall makes inspection important, emphasized the MSC farm crops specialist. Sick wheat may be developing or weevils may be

increasing. Pettigrove was on one farm in late August where the farmer stored seed wheat at just under 14 per cent moisture. The wheat was on the second floor of a metal-and-wooden structure under a metal roof; high temperatures put this grain "out of condition" even though moisture was down. Pettigrove explains. "Checking stored grain gives the farmer a chance to treat or move it as necessary, he points out.

Musty or moldy wheat becomes sample grain — the lowest grade possible — and is discounted in line with the elevator's ability to dispose of it, claims Pettigrove. Sprouted and sick wheat are classed as "total damage" and the grade varies with per cent of damage to the entire lot — from grade 1 for 2 per cent damage to grade 5 for 15 per cent damage, he states. All over 15 per cent are sample grade. Discounts vary season to season and elevator to elevator, he adds; this depends on the wheat volume and ability of the elevator manager to handle and use such wheat.

POLE BARN OFFER SOME ADVANTAGES FOR FARMERS

Many new barns going up in Michigan are being built of poles, reports A. J. Bell, extension agricultural engineer at Michigan State College. He passes along the information that they make an economical and efficient type building for beef cattle, dairy cows or sheep. One advantage, he notes, is that the farmer can shift from one type of livestock to another with a minimum of expense.

Pole barns have other advantages, he advises: The simple pole frame takes less time fitting and cutting and reduces the skilled labor required. There is no foundation and this saves time, labor and material. Pole frames can be covered with sheet metal or lumber. With the open pan type of barn, there are no ventilating problems.

Bell gives some essential instructions on the building: Set poles five feet into the ground on a six-inch concrete pad. Treat the poles; poles pressure treated with pentachlorophenol or creosote will last 35 to 40 years. Nailing girls do not need to be buttered; ends can be lapped to save time and labor.
