with the state by March 1, 1953. In the meantime, a survey of all of the proposals must be completed and a decision reached as to the most practical plan. Once the decision has been made, work can begin on the detailed plans. The sewer system must be completed and in operation by July 1, 1954.

L. N. Hayden, city engineer, and Tennant are working together on the survey and the drafting of tentative plans. The material will be submitted to the City Council as soon as it has been completed.
