1953 CONSERVATION PROGRAM BEGINS IN OAKLAND COUNTY

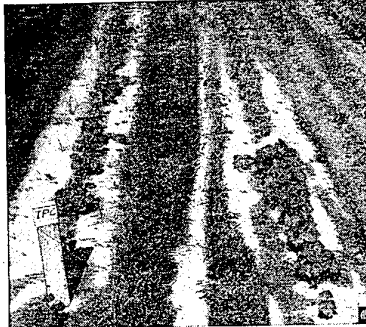
The 1953 Agricultural Conservation Program is under way in Oakland County, says Walter R. Cook, chairman of the County Production and Marketing Administration committee. Instruction meeting for community committees has been held and in several townships, these committees are contacting farmers.

The committees are prepared to help individual farmers make the best possible use of the assistance provided under ACP for soil and water conservation practices.

Where technical advice is needed, the chairman said, it is available through such agencies as the Soil Conservation Service, the Extension Service and Forest Service. The purpose of the committee's visit will be to help the farmer to determine the most needed conservation on his farm and to acquaint the farmer with the assistance available through the Agricultural Conservation Program.

To be eligible to participate in the 1953 Agricultural Conservation Program, a farm plan must be signed before January 1, 1953. In some townships this work must be done by mail and the farmer will be contacted by letter.

New Weed Control Being Developed



A cotton field that has been pre-emergent treated with Chloro-IPC shows control of grass in 7-inch bands on each side of row. Development of a new chemical for control of weeds and grasses in field crops, soybeans, alfalfa, vegetables and especially cotton, promises an important contribution to the continuing mechanization of agriculture. Experiments now being conducted with the new herbicide, designated Chloro-IPC, show favorable control of certain annual grasses and broadleaf weeds for a variety of crops. Of importance to farmers is the fact that the research indicates that it is not in the very early seedling stage of the weeds to be controlled. Effects last about four to six weeks in the soil, although both longer and shorter periods have been reported. Soil temperature seems to be the most important factor and rainfall secondary. The higher the temperature, the shorter the effective period.

Farm Loan Approval Policy Revised To Assure Continued Production

Farmers Home Administration announced a change in loan approval methods by the County F.H.A. Committee. Applications will be certified by the local Committee for the maximum amount which may be loaned to an applicant for farm operating for any one crop year, according to O. W. Moore, F.H.A. supervisor. This change became effective on October 20 of this year. Previously County Committee action was necessary for each loan application regardless of whether the applicant applied for one or more loans during the year.

A newly appointed committee for Oakland County is Frank Rugles of Milford. The F.H.A. county committee is made up of three members from the county who are reputable farmers or businessmen dealing with agriculture. Other committee members are Fred Beckman of White Lake Township and Wilton Andrews of Pontiac Township.

MILK PRODUCERS HOLD ANNUAL MEET AT MICHIGAN STATE

The 36th annual meeting of the Michigan Milk Producers' Association will be held at the Fairchild Theater, Michigan State College, on November 5 at 10:00 a.m. Luncheon will be served at noon in People's Church.

The Michigan Milk Producers Association has been active in its service to its dairy farmer members, which now number approximately 16,000.

Officials of the organization point out that in recent years the number of members, the volume of their product marketed through the association and the marketing facilities have constantly increased.

Furthermore, it tends to promote business in a community through its assistance because of the value of the agricultural products produced.

Experts Advise Using Wet Brewers Grains

Wet brewers grains may replace a part of a dairy herd's grain ration, advise dairy extension specialists at Michigan State College.

Four pounds of the mash about equals one pound of grain ration suitable for the roughage a hard is getting.

On a protein basis, wet brewers grains equal about one-fifth of a high protein concentrate. It is worth about one-fifth of cereal grains.

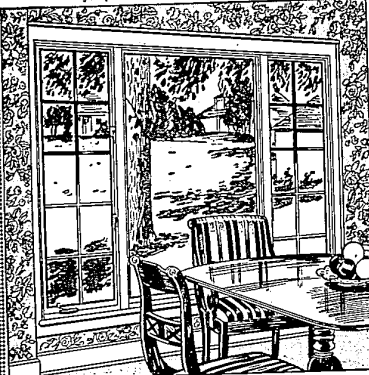

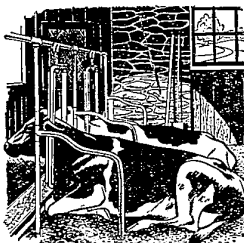

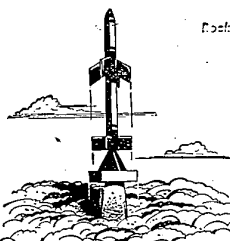
Sawdust found excellent for cattle bedding

Sawdust or shavings will make warm, absorbent bedding for dairy cattle, according to reports from Michigan State College's Upper Peninsula Experiment Station at Chatham. Folks there have found that, under controlled conditions, sawdust or shavings have no harmful effect on soil when the manure is later applied to fields. Bedding the herd on sawdust will also mean savings in liquid manure. Northern Michigan dairymen usually find shavings easy to obtain; in other sections, good supplies can be picked up from nearby sawmills.
