## Extra Point Wins For F.H.S. Reserves

Farmington High's Reserves took a 7-6 thriller from Howell under the lights at Howell on November 4.

Howell's score came late in the first period on a pass play covering approximately 50 yards. Neither team threatened seriously during the rest of the first half.

In the third period, Farmington outplayed Howell but was still unable to score.

With four minutes left in the fourth quarter, Bob Markham broke through Howell's line to block a punt. The ball was recovered by M. Hardy, Farmington guard, on Howell's 15-yard line.

In three plays, Farmington had a first down on Howell's four. With less than two minutes left, J. Petty scored from the four on two identical line plunges. Petty then kicked the extra point to provide the game-winning margin for Farmington.

This was the Farmington J. V.'s last game of the current season. Their record was three wins as against three losses, a marked improvement over last year's record.

The game, which seemed certain to end in a deadlock, thrilled the small gathering of Clarencville fans from start to finish.

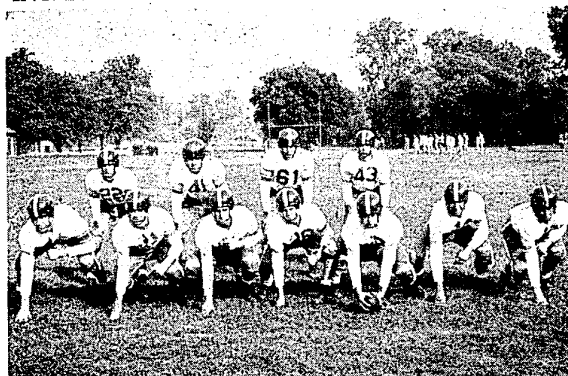

## Gridders Defeat Bentley High 14-0 To End Season

Doublet, Cowart Score, Crinlon's Kicks Good

Farmington High's Falcons chalked up their seventh straight win by defeating the Bentley Bulldogs 14-0 under the lights at Redford Union in the final game of the season on November 8.

The first half featured fine defensive play by both teams with Bentley's backs, led by Riddling and Olson, moving the ball to the Farmington 15. On a fourth down, a field goal attempt went wide. Farmington's Larry Pink intercepted a Bentley pass and carried to the Bulldogs seven. Crinlon's fourth down field goal attempt was partially blocked after the Bentley line had held Farmington for three plays.

Early in the third quarter the Falcons, aided by a 15-yard penalty, marched 49 yards for a touchdown. After the penalty moved the ball to the Bentley 37, Frank Doublet went 13 yards to the 5. On the next play Doublet scored. Crinlon's conversion made the score 7-0.

Farmington scored in five more plays after Tyler ran Adams' punt back 20 yards to the 50. In four plays Staley, Pink and Doublet carried to the Bulldogs 20. Cowart went 50 yards on a reverse for the tally. Crinlon's kick was good and Farmington led 14-0.

Bentley's only scoring chance in the fourth quarter was thwarted when Tim Thomas recovered a Bulldog fumble on the Farmington three. Fine defensive play by Lemon, Calhoun, Thomas, Klees, Tyler and Cowart held the game. Farmington's threat was halted on the Bentley six when time ran out.

The win gave the Falcons their second Inter-Lakes Conference title in as many years. The Farmington eleven won all of the conference games and were defeated only by Redford in the first non-conference tilt this season by a 13-6 score.
