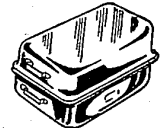
Seniors Will Receive Pictures in December

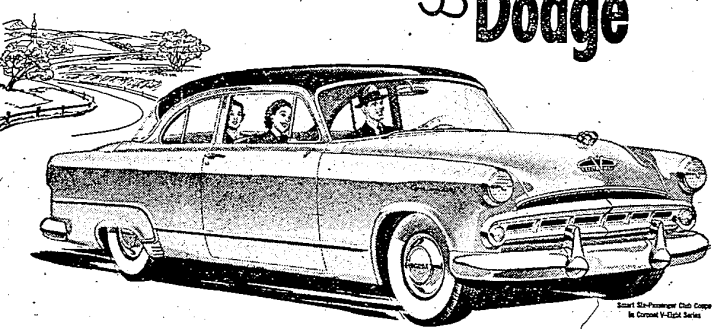

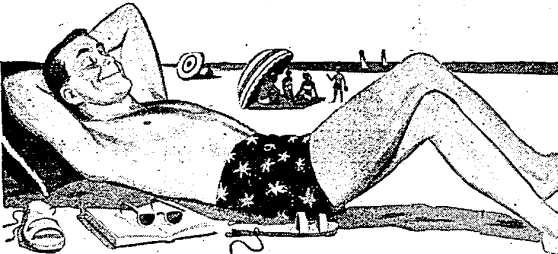

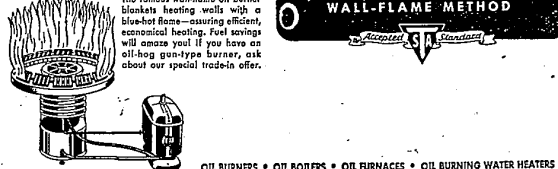
