## TRAFFIC SAFETY INVENTORY PLAN GAINS IN STATE

The traffic safety inventory program in Michigan has shown splendid progress in the last year with nearly double the number of cities participating. Harry Porter, senior engineer for the National Safety Council, reported at a meeting of officers assigned to the safety of the traffic division of the state Police.

The State Police administer the program in Michigan for the State Safety Commission. It is supported nationally by the safety council, which acts for the president's highway safety conference. Participation is limited to cities of 10,000 or more population and to cities with a population of 55 or more. In this state 35 took part last year as compared with 18 the year previously.

On the basis of detailed reports submitted by the cities and covering various factors such as traffic law enforcement, engineering, accident records and related subjects, the safety council prepares an annual inventory analysis showing the ratings of each community as compared with national standards and containing recommendations for improvement. These inventories are presented in each city at a meeting with local officials. The presentations in Michigan for this year have just been completed by members of the State Police, assisted by Porter and Maxwell Halsey, secretary of the State Safety Commission.

Progress reported in Michigan last year on the basis of inventory recommendations of the previous year included hiring of additional police for traffic law enforcement, formation of several local safety councils, adoption of the uniform traffic ticket and the uniform court penalty plan, hiring of a traffic engineer in one community and stippling up public information.

The inventory program is regarded as a most effective and powerful facility in the promotion of local traffic safety. A number of national traffic safety achievement awards, including first places for the nation, have been received by Michigan cities which have been participating in it for several years.
