

Pvt. William Kahrl Serves in Korea

Army Private William B. Kahrl, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Kahrl of 33516 State Street, has been serving in Korea with the 99th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, which recently began its third year in the Korean combat zone.

In its first two years of action, the battalion fired more than 180,000 rounds against the Communists and sometimes operated in front of infantry mortar units in an attack.

The 99th is part of I Corps, which twice has pushed the Communists north of the 38th parallel.

Private Kahrl, a mechanic has been in Korea since October 8.

UNITED DEFENSE FUND SOLICITS CONTINUED SUPPORT

More than 77 million visits have been made to USO operations here and overseas by military personnel and their families in the past two years. E. A. Rogers, president of the United Defense Fund, pointed out this week in a report marking the second anniversary of the fund. USO is one of six participating agencies of UDF, for which funds are raised in Michigan through the United Health and Welfare Fund.

In the past two years, he said, American Relief for Korea, an other UDF agency, has shipped nearly six million pounds of clothing to war refugees in Korea and the American Social Hygiene Association has given service to approximately 500 communities in relation to social hygiene problems. The Association also made 20,000 reports on prostitution to military and civilian officials and gave health information to servicemen. USO Camp Shows, reactivated in January, 1951, has sent out 115 entertainment units to American servicemen in Korea, Alaska, the Mediterranean and Europe, in its twenty-two months of operation. UDF is now seeking a goal of \$19,151,340 to make possible the continuation of the important defense-related programs of its six participating agencies. In 1953, its support comes from the American people primarily through Red Feather and other united community campaigns. In Michigan it is a member agency of the United Health and Welfare Fund.
