## Advise Mulching Now For Best Results

If you have not done so, now is a good time to apply mulch to your shrubbery, evergreens, roses and strawberries. It has been advised to wait until now so that the ground would be frozen. Main reason to wait until the ground is

frozen so that the meadow mice will have their nests established and not make them in your mulch. Some people wait until nearly spring to mulch strawberries because, they say, they are interested in protecting only for alter-

nate freezing and thawing. This practice is not advisable because strawberries are injured by cold weather.

To protect tea roses, cut them down to about 3 or 4 buds high and cover them with soil. After the soil has frozen apply about six inches of mulch.

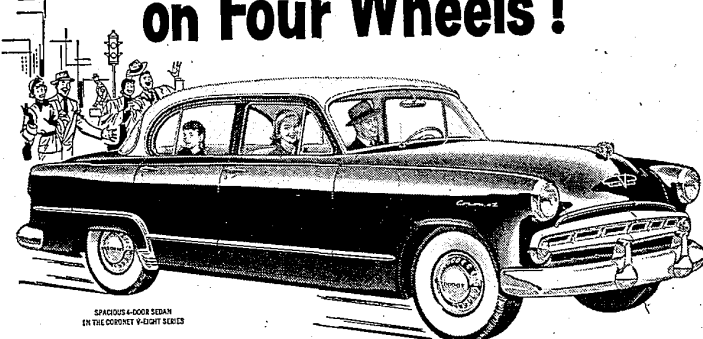

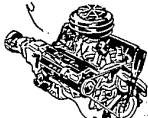
