Tarpayers are reminded that winter tax statements must be paid by January 20 to avoid penalty. This is a change from previous years when taxes could be paid up to March 1 without penalty. After that date taxes must be paid at the Coalcand County Treasurer's office in Pontlac: Unpaid taxes become delinquent after March 1. Under the new change neither the township nor the city are allowed any collection fee. Previously a 1% fee was allowed to local units for the collecting of taxes.
