

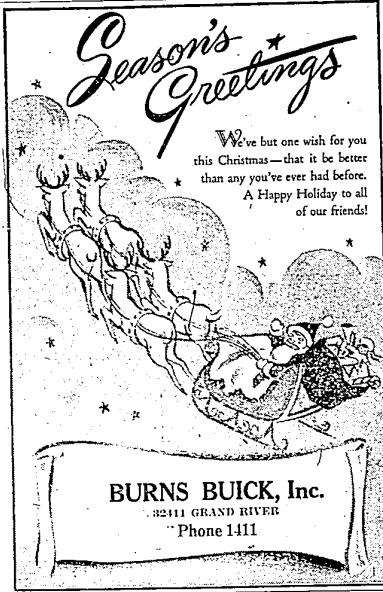

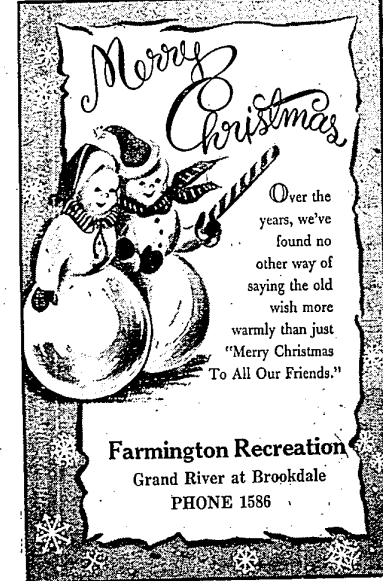

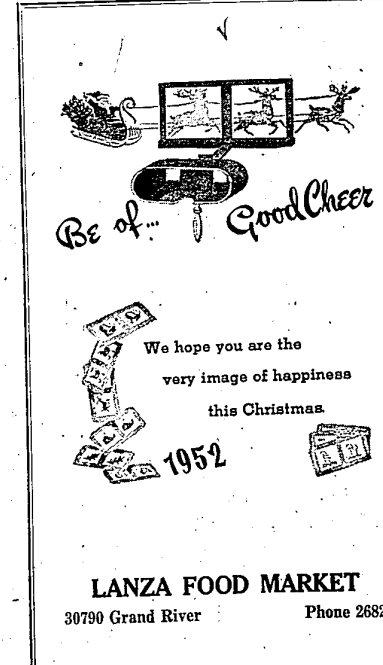

Present Resolution Calling For More Christian Observance Of Yuletide

The Rt. Rev. Richard S. Emrich, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, and president of the Detroit Council of Churches, and Dr. G. Merrill Lenox, executive director of the Council, have just released, on behalf of the Board of Directors of the Council, a resolution, calling for a more Christian observance of the Christmas season. The resolution follows:

WHEREAS, Christmas is the sacred season of the year when we celebrate the birth of the Saviour of mankind; and

WHEREAS, There is an obvious tendency to forget its sacred character, and to commercialize and secularize this holy season; and

WHEREAS, We must always be on guard against forces inside and outside our nation which weaken our spiritual heritage;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the Detroit Council of Churches

OAKLAND GROUPS PLAN WORK ON HOSPITAL CHRISTMAS

Organizations throughout Oakland County are turning out decorations this week to make sure that Christmas trees at Pontiac State Hospital won't be bare this year.

With the "Christmas-On-The-High-Seas" project scarcely behind them, leaders of Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross, turned to coordinating work of groups helping in "Operation Hospital Christmas."

Men, women and children are stringing cranberries and popcorn; making pine cleaner tree ornaments; and wrapping gifts to brighten December 25 for mental patients.

Pontiac Girl Scout troops, Camp Fire Girls, Soroptimists Club, Junior Women's Club and Boys Club are working on the project.

So are Cranbrook and Birmingham High students; Birmingham Girl Scouts; members of the women's group of Ferndale Drayton Avenue Presbyterian Church.

Students of Pontiac's Washington Junior High School and members of All Saints Episcopal Church are also turning out Christmas knickknacks for the State Hospital.

"Operation Hospital Christmas" had its beginning this fall when the state hospital — confronted with a lean pocketbook due to shortage of cash in Michigan's treasury — told the Red Cross of decorations needed. The Red Cross, in turn, told various organizations — and the county-wide project resulted.

Red Cross "High Seas" Christmas project this year was one of the most successful since the program began. More than \$400 in cash and a total of 253 gift boxes were donated for servicemen and women who will spend December 25 somewhere at sea.

Tagged Doe 'Tagged' After Twelve Years

A tagged doe at least 13 years old was shot near Grayling during the "any deer" portion of the regular deer season, conservation officer Clarence Roberts reports.

The aged doe was tagged in the Hanson game area near Grayling on March 10, 1941. She was shot about four miles from the point of release.

Her record shows she was a fawn, probably born in the spring of 1940, when tagged and released.

Michigan State Parks Damaged In Storm

Grand Haven state park was hardest hit during the recent Lake Michigan storm that raced along the state's western shoreline with hurricane force, while Holland and Muskegon state parks reported lesser damage.

Conservation department reports from Grand Haven show beach slides and swings damaged, sections of pavement broken or undermined by wave action, and the beach littered with logs, branches and other trash.

Holland and Muskegon parks were only slightly damaged. Winds estimated at 35 miles per hour raced across the shore area for ten hours.

Eggs need a cool, moist storage — don't try the furnace room.

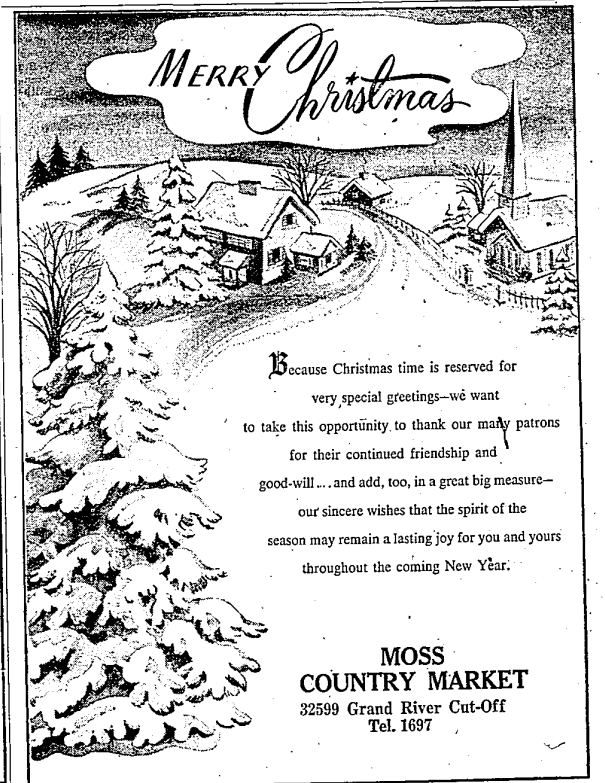
HOSPITAL BED SHORTAGE

Intensified case - finding and improved treatment of TB have made the shortage of hospital beds more acute. The TB and Health Society joined with public health authorities and mustered other groups to gain \$2,800,000 state appropriations for new hospital beds since late 1951. 87 beds are now completed at Herman Klefer Hospital, a \$2,600,000 wing will add another 250 beds.
