Since milk is usually stressed as baby's best food, Dr. Ruth M. Heyn, pediatrician at the University Hospital and research assistant in the Simpson Memorial Institution.

that milk is all the baby needs
for healthy growth.

causes "milk anemia", the commonest form of anemia found in
young children. It results from


